- E. At the February 10. 2020 Board Work Session the Board discussed the Superintendent's Evaluation and when compensation changes should occur. - C. CISD General Fund Budget
 - As of July 1, 2004, state law requires an intermediate school district to have its proposed budget reviewed by its constituent districts each year (MCL380.624). The law requires that by May 1, the budget be presented to the constituent districts and that by June 1 each constituent district adopt a Board resolution expressing support for or disapproval of the proposed budget. The MPS Board is being presented with the proposed CISD general fund budget for 2020-21 as required for review and discussion. A resolution will be brought before the Board for action prior to June 1.

A. Approve a budget adjustment

BACKGROUND

A. Each year school Boards are required to adopt budgets by June 30th. Assumptions are used when projecting revenues and expenditures. It is common to change projections based on events that occur after the budget is adopted. As a result, we typically will recommend two or three budget adjustments. This will be the first budget adjustment since adoption of the original budget.

A. Approve leasing two buses for transporting Michigan Youth Challenge Academy (MYCA) students

BACKGROUND

A. The district submitted a Bid Notice to lease two new 84-passenger regular education school busses limited to 20,000 miles per year per bus. Bids were due by February 18, 2020 at 2:00 PM. Two vendors responded. The Transportation Director is proposing awarding the bid to Midwest Transit to lease two 84-passenger regular education buses from Midwest Transit at a cost of \$28,625 per bus per year for two years.
