










#### Percent of Students by Composite Level and Window

### **Pathways Information**

### There are seven indicators displayed in this report. Details about each are described below:

#### 1. A Good Start in Kindergarten

- 1A. Three and four-year-old students have access to quality Pre-K services.
- 1B. Students enter kindergarten academically prepared.
- 1C. Students exit kindergarten academically prepared for first grade.

### 2. Reading Well by Third Grade

- 2A. Third grade students exit 3rd grade reading and writing on grade level.
- 2B. Third grade students whose first language is not English make sufficient progress towards attaining English proficiency.

#### 3. Elementary School Success

- 3A. Students exit elementary school proficient in ELA (English/Language Arts), math, and science (5th or 6th grade students, depending on school).

### 6. Academically Prepared, Graduate On Time, and Prepared for College/Career

- 6A. Eleventh grade students are academically on track by the end of 11th grade.
- 6B. Eleventh grade students demonstrate STEM preparation by the end of 11th grade.
- 6C. Eleventh grade students prepare for post-secondary school or training.



#### Graduation Rate by Grad Year and School








## Graduation Rates by Race/Ethnicity












