# PRESENTS POLICY HIGHLIGHTS

School Use of Automatic Calling and Text-Messaging Services: Many Connecticut school districts use automated calling and text-messaging services to communicate with parents, students and staff about various issues. Today's digital communication channels help parents/guardians stay connected to their child's school experience.

The Telecommunications Consumer Protection Act (TCPA) governs the transmission of certain automated calls and text messages to cell phones, including calls and texts from public schools to parents/guardians. The TCPA law and implementing rules from the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC") and specifically the interpretation of limits regarding public schools, have been in effect for several years.

The law prohibited any non-emergency calls using an automatic telephone dialing system (autodialer) or an artificial or prerecorded voice to a wireless number without the prior consent of the recipient. These are the calls commonly known as "robocalls." Such calls, according to the FCC encompass both voice calls and text messages.

The FCC issued a Declaratory Ruling (CG Docket No. 02-278 Declaratory Ruling FCC 16-88) on August 4, 2016 that clarified when schools may make certain robocalls to student family wireless phones without prior express consent. The ruling states that "school callers may lawfully make robocalls and send automated texts to student family wireless phones pursuant to an 'emergency purpose' exception in the law or with prior express consent without violating the Telephone Consumer Protection Act (TCPA)." The declaratory ruling further clarified that the "emergency exception" applies to "emergencies including weather closure, fire, health risks, threats and unexcused absences." Therefore, school districts do not need to have express written consent before placing robocalls or sending automated text messages in the case of these enumerated emergencies.

In addition, the FCC stated that schools generally may place robocalls or automated text messages for matters that are closely related to the mission of the school. Such matters include parent-teacher conferences, school events, and school surveys, if the parent/guardian has not opted out of such communications. The FCC found that no prior express consent is required for these communications because providing a cell phone number amounts to providing implied consent to receive such communications. The FCC stated that "persons who knowingly release their telephone numbers have in effect given their invitation or permission to be called at the number which they have given, absent instruction to the contrary."

Schools are encouraged by the FCC to disclose the full range of potential calls and messages that a parent/guardian should expect to receive. The ruling stated, "We confirm that school callers may lawfully make robocalls and send automated texts to student family wireless phones pursuant to an 'emergency purpose' exception or with prior express consent without violating the Telephone Consumer Protection Act." The FCC acknowledged that a person merely giving out his/her telephone number could constitute consent, but only as long as the robocalls is closely related to the purpose for which the person gave out the number. Further, the FCC has reaffirmed that schools must honor all revocation requests and opt-out requests from parents/guardians who do not wish to receive such communications.

Therefore, in the school context, robocalls that relate to a situation affecting the health and safety of students and faculty fall under the emergency purpose exception and do not require prior consent. The FCC also provided examples of situations that affect the health and safety of students and faculty or situations closely related to the school's mission. These include messages or calls relating to the following:

- Weather-related closures
- Incidents of danger to the school due to fire
- Dangerous persons or health risks (such as a toxic spill)
- Unexcused absences
- Notification of an upcoming teacher conference or general school activity
- Surveys to provide input on school-related issues

Regarding unexcused absences, the FCC noted that this type of situation affects student safety because a missing child could be in danger and that some states require schools to notify parents of an unexcused absence for safety reasons.

The FCC also encouraged schools to regularly update their emergency contact list so that these types of calls, which do not require prior express consent, reach the intended party to whom the call may be very important. Robocalls to the wrong party implicate the privacy of those who mistakenly receive it and may violate the privacy of students or their safety. In addition, the sending of robocalls to the wrong parties could result in significant financial penalties levied against the school district. Therefore, districts have a vested interest in ensuring that they do not send robocalls to incorrect parties.

School districts that have agreements with vendors for their robocalls should review their contracts in order to be sure that the vendors, not the school district, are responsible for the vendors' mistakes. Districts should also be assured that the vendors with whom they are working, have processes for updating wrong numbers immediately. The school district's attorney should also review agreements with telecommunications vendors in advance of their signing.

In conclusion, to minimize some risks involving robocalls, consider the following:

- Robocalls are permitted without prior consent if the district limits such calls to notice of emergency items.
- If informational items will be sent, either work with legal counsel to limit the subjects to those closely related to school operations or obtain prior effective consent for the calls.

- Establish a clear protocol between the district and its vendor, if any, to correct wrong numbers immediately.
- Seek legal review of the district's vendor agreement for robocalls in order to ensure that the vendor, not the district will be responsible for errors.

**Policy Implications:** Policy, #1110.4, "Automated Telephone Calls/Text Messages," pertains to this issue. This is considered an optional policy for inclusion in the district's manual. However, it is imperative, even if districts do not place such a policy in their manual, to be aware of the legal restrictions pertaining to the use of this rapidly expanded use of the available technology for automated communication.

<u>Training Program for Sexual Harassment Training Released</u>: P.A. 19-16, An Act Combatting Sexual Assault and Sexual Harassment, made various changes concerning sexual harassment, sexual assault and the filing of discrimination complaints with the Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities ((CHRO). The legislation became effective on October 1, 2019.

Sections 1, 3 & 9 of this lengthy legislation expanded the requirements for employers on training employees about sexual harassment laws and providing related information, and required CHRO to make related training materials available.

Previous law required employers with at least 50 employees to provide supervisory employees with two hours of training on federal and state sexual harassment laws and remedies available to victims. The Act expands this requirement to cover employers of any size and also non-supervisory employees for employers with at least three employees.

Such training must occur within one year of October 1, 2019, except that any employer who provided the Act's training after October 1, 2018, is not required to provide it a second time.

The Act required CHRO to develop and make available to employers a free, online training and education video or other interactive method that fulfills the Act's training requirements. As long as CHRO does so, the Act's required employee training must take place within six months of the hiring date, starting October 1, 2019, for all new hires by employers with at least three employees and all new supervisory hires by smaller employers.

CHRO has released the sexual harassment prevention training in accordance with the legislation. It also offered some additional guidance on implementing the new law. The additional guidance makes clear that the scope of P.A. 19-16 is intended to reach any employer that employs any individual in Connecticut, provided it also employs at least three employees in total, regardless of location.

CHRO has also taken the position that current employees must complete the required training within one year, or by October 1, 2020.

In addition, employers required to provide this training must provide supplemental training at least every 10 years to update employees on the content of the training and education.

Also, employers with three or more employees have been required to post in a prominent and accessible place a notice stating that sexual harassment is illegal and the remedies available to victims. This Act requires these employers to also send a copy of this information to employees by email within three months of their hire if the employer has provided an email account to the employee or the employee has provided the employer with an email address. If an employer has not provided email accounts to employees, it must post the information on its website, if it has one.

The Act required CHRO to develop and include on its website a link about the illegality of sexual harassment and the remedies available to victims. An employer can comply with the requirement above by providing this link to employees by email, text message, or in writing.

**Policy Implications:** This new legislation impacts policy #4118.112/4218.112, "Sexual Harassment" and its accompanying administrative regulation and forms. This is a recommended policy for placement in a district's policy manual. Due to the total number of changes made by this legislation, previous CABE samples of these materials have been removed from CABE's resource file and replaced by new samples. Districts are urged to replace their existing policy and administrative regulation with the new models and to fully comply with the training requirements.
