Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Guidance Focuses on ELL Students: The federal Department of Education recently released new guidelines on how states and school districts can better serve students whose first language isn't English. English-language learners are estimated to be nearly 10 percent of the student population nationwide according to the Department. The new federal guidelines explain how states and districts can spend money through Title III, which provides federal funds for English-language learners and immigrant students under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Districts have historically had to spend their funds on professional development and providing language instruction educational programs. But ESSA now requires that districts do more, like reaching out to families, parents and communities in order to better serve students. The Guidance, which is currently non-binding until the 2017-2018 school year, also covers a range of fiscal issues.

In addition, the guidelines address specific populations of English-language learner, such as those with disabilities and preschoolers. The Education Department recommends that states start planning this fall or winter to accommodate changes involving English-language learners that take effect under ESSA beginning July 1, 2017. For example, the new law moved some things out of Title III and into Title I, and it set new requirements. States must establish entrance and exit procedures for English-language learners, and include their progress toward achieving English proficiency in new systems for holding schools and districts accountable.

ESSA largely puts states in the driver's seat when it comes to how to rate schools and intervene in schools that aren't making progress. The transparency requirements, however, can help advocates and policymakers ensure that states, schools, and districts are still making progress with historically overlooked groups of students. They were part of the law's bipartisan bargain.

ESSA calls for states and districts to report on the percentage of students who have been identified as long-term English-language learners, those students who have attended school in the United States for five years or more without being reclassified as proficient in English.

Districts and states must also track the performance of former ELLs for four years to "determine whether they are performing academically on par with their never-EL peers or whether gaps in achievement remain." Tracking this data will help educators better judge the effectiveness of English-learner services and district and state policies around how and when students are determined to no longer need language services, the Guidance states.

The Guidance also makes it clear that districts and states can use their English Language Acquisition grants, provided through a \$737 million program also known as Title III of ESSA, for many of the same purposes as they did under No Child Left Behind. That's true even though schools' accountability for ensuring ELLs progress in their English-proficiency has moved to Title I of the law, along with accountability for all other groups of kids.

Therefore, states are allowed to use their Title III funds to help identify ELLs who are struggling, make sure their English-language proficiency tests match up with English-language proficiency standards, and align state content standards with English-language proficiency standards. Districts can use Title III funds to help notify parents that their child is an English-learner.

States and districts can also use their Title III money to help meet some of the new transparency and reporting requirements in ESSA that are aimed at getting a better understanding of ELLs and former ELLs.

States and districts now need to make it possible for researchers and the public to see how kids who fall into more than one subgroup of students, including English-learners with learning disabilities, are progressing.

Policy Implications: ESSA contains some key provisions that may shift the way schools will have to identify, serve, test and report information about students who do not speak English.

States are required in their State plans to demonstrate that they have developed Statewide English language proficiency standards that are aligned with the State's academic content standards. All districts that enrolls ELLs must implement the English proficiency standards and that the State plan must provide for an annual assessment of proficiency of all English learners and the assessments are to be aligned with the State's English language learner standards.

The ESSA requires states to create a uniform process for identifying English learners, assigning them services, and later, moving them out of EL classes and into general education. Under NCLB, districts made their own processes, which resulted in a variety of criteria for entering and exiting English learner services across districts. The new law mandates a state level of consistency. A major change in ESSA comes with its expectations for English proficiency among the English language population. It could require significantly better services for non-English speaking students. NCLB held schools accountable for helping their students improve English proficiency under Title III. ESSA indicates schools must build English proficiency rates into their accountability framework for Title I, which provides money to support low income students more broadly.

In addition, ESSA changes the expectation that language instruction educational programs be "scientifically based" with a new expectation, that the programs be "effective."

The district's language instruction educational program is not required by the Guidance to provide any particular curricula, program of instruction or instructional materials, nor does it prohibit any language instruction educational program used with English learners that is consistent with Title III of the ESEA or other laws. States and local districts may select any language program that is effective. However, states will be required to monitor the local districts in implementing Title III. The Guidance also address the topics of standardized testing on state assessments and reporting of this population.

Policy # 6141.311, "Programs for Limited English Proficient Students," pertains to this topic. Current samples were last revised in August 2015.

The ESSA Guidance, actions of Connecticut's State Department of Education and ESSA final regulations, when promulgated, will be used to determine what changes to this policy area will be required prior to the start of the new school year in July, 2017.

This is one of many policy areas that potentially will have to be changed as we transition from NCLB to the new ESSA, scheduled for full implementation in the 2017-2018 school year.
