## COVID HEALTH SCREENER

Have you experienced any of the following symptoms in the last 48 hours?	YES	NO
<b>New or Unexpected:</b>		
Fever or chills		
New uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing (unusual coughing symptoms for those with chronic allergies/asthmatic cough)		
Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing		
Muscle or body aches, fatigue, headaches		
New loss of taste or smell		
Sore throat		
Congestion and runny nose		
Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea		
<p>Within the past 14 days, have you been in close physical contact (6 feet or closer for at least 15 minutes) with a person who is known to have laboratory-confirmed COVID-19 or with anyone who has any symptoms consistent with COVID-19?</p> <p>Within the past 14 days, has a public health or medical professional told you to self-monitor, or self-quarantine because of concerns about COVID-19 infection? This includes if you are waiting on the results of a COVID-19 test that was recommended by a medical professional.</p>		

### If they answered "YES" to any of the questions.

- It's recommended the employee/student stays home, and continues to monitor the symptoms and/or seek medical counsel from their healthcare provider.
- Employee: If at school, the employee will be asked to go home.
- Student: If at school, staff asks a nearby campus supervisor to walk with the student to the Designated Care Room. If a staff member is not available, staff calls the office to assist with escorting the student to the Designated Room.

### If answered "NO", proceed with taking his/her temperature.

- Temperature is less than 100.4°F (100.3°F and BELOW)
- The employee/student is allowed to go to school

### If temperature is at or higher than 100.4°F

- If temperature is at or higher than 100.4°F employee/student should stay home and/or call their healthcare provider for medical counsel.
- Employee: If at school and rescreening does not meet the "safe temperature" criteria, contact your supervisor or school/district nurse.
- Student: If at school and rescreening is at 100.4 or above, staff will ask a nearby supervisor to walk with the student to the Designated Care Room. If a staff member is not available, staff will call the office staff to assist with escorting the student to the Isolation Room.
