**EXPLANATION OF TRANSCRIPT**

The South Carolina legislature required all public high schools to implement the South Carolina Uniform Grading Scale Policy beginning with the 2000-2001 school year. The policy required all existing letter grades be converted to numeric grades. The grading scale designates the quality point range for each numeric scale and designates the quality point range for each numeric grade and gives weighted credit to Honors and Advanced Placement courses. The grade point conversion table is shown below.

### 4. AP Capstone Diploma Program

AP Capstone™ is a diploma program from the College Board. It's based on two yearlong AP courses: AP Seminar and AP Research.

#### Highlights:

A student will take a minimum of seven Advanced Placement courses with a strong emphasis on math and science. Students may earn both an Honors Diploma and STEM (Science, Technology, and Engineering and Mathematics) Diploma. With qualifying scores on the national AP Exams, many colleges provide credit hours, saving time and money for these students.

## ADVANCED PLACEMENT

To enroll in Advanced Placement (AP) courses, students must earn above average grades in pre-requisite courses and must obtain teacher recommendation AP courses are given additional grade points and are designed as so on the transcript. All subjects and grades are included in the computation of cumulative grade point averages. The cumulative grade point average is used to determine class rank with the rank of one being assigned to the highest average. All members of the class are included in the ranking process.
