

 Keep the start and dismissal times to as close to what they are currently 			
Have an earlier rather than a later start time for elementary students			
• Ensure times for elementary students accommodate childcare needs as well as family and work schedules			
Keep start and dismissal times that allow a reasonable commute time and family schedule for staff			
Have an early start time for high school students

Transportation by the Numbers

- 30,100 September 2022 enrollment
 - 324 students with special education services on 37 busses
 - 6,936 regular education student riders on 61 busses
 - 278 students w/ specialized transportation from outside service providers (homeless, special education)
- 81 shuttles
 - 52 elementary band/orchestra
 - 25 Quest
 - 4 Choice
- 1,077 Metro passes issued
- \$14.6 Million Annual Expenditures
 - 83% state funded \$12.1 million
 - 17% district funded \$2.5 million

Transportation Tiers and Routes

Capacity for change of routes, tiers, and the labor pool.



Routes and Tiers

- Tier is a run for 1 school
- Route is multiple tiers done by same bus (AM and PM)
- Routes Create Efficiency
 - Maximize ridership
 - Allow multiple tiers per day
 - Minimize idle time of busses
 - Minimize empty bus transitions
 - Maximize labor (more hours)



Variable: Tiers, Routes, Labor

- Can we find efficiency within our current system?
- Are there ways to add or split tiers to create capacity?
- How many drivers can we add realistically?
 - Operational Cost
 - Capital Cost
 - Storage of busses
 - Number of busses.



Start and End Times

Changing the minimum start time and the maximum end time, lengthens the day and potentially creates additional flexibility between tiers.

Variable: Lower and Upper Limits

What is too early?

- 7:30 AM lower limit currently?
 - HS are longer routes (45 min)
- Differs by age of student?
- Determines first tier start
- Impacts labor pool
- Traffic patterns

What is too late?

- 4:00 PM upper limit?
 - Preschool Currently
- Differs by age of student?
- Determines last tier end
- Impacts labor pool
- Traffic patterns



Length of Student Day

Varying the length of the student day is a strategy other districts have used to create time within tiered systems for varied start times.



Required Instructional Days and Hours

State Minimum Requirements

180-day School Year

Instructional Hours (Can be met with 1,027 hour average for grades 1-12)

- Kindergarten 1,000 hours
- Grade 1-8 1,000 hours
- Grades 9-12 1,080 hours

Determined by student start and end times

- - lunch time
- - early release time
- - half days
- late starts

- Added 20 minutes per day to High School schedule.

- Elementary and Middle pushed start and end times by 20 minutes to accommodate the HS later dismissal

Alternative Transportation

Relying on outside sources to provide transportation for our students.



Alternate Providers — Specialized Transportation Outsourced


- Approximately 278 students daily
 - Students with special needs American Logistics Company (ALC)
 - Students with McKinney Vento status Hop, Skip and Drive
- Annual Cost Approximately:
 - Students w/ special needs-\$825,000
 - McKinney Vento- \$871,500



Alternate Providers – *Metro Outsourced*

- Metro provided transportation for Lake Washington High School
 - Three routes part of Metro's regular service area
 - Two routes LWSD specific paid by the district \$198,000
 - Post pandemic route pressure
- Metro ORCA cards free for all students across the district
- Meeting w/ Metro representatives October 20
 - Juanita Route 230 and 225
 - Redmond Route 221, 250, 224
 - Eastlake Route 269 (Sahalee Way)

Service Levels

Districts have created space in transportation schedules to accommodate start time changes by changing levels of service.



Administrative Procedures 6605P

• School districts are not actually required to provide student transportation to and from school except for selected students with disabilities. Most do though.

Radius for bussing set at 1 mile in our procedure.

• If a district provides transportation, students may not be required to walk more than <u>two miles</u>.

Lake Washington District Current Practice

Qualifying for Bus Service

Outside one-mile radius

- Or unless no suggested walk routes exist
- And Students receiving Special Education services with need

Exceeding limits eligible for bus service.

- Elementary may walk up to one and a half miles
- Middle and high may walk up to two miles.

Hazardous criteria for determination of ridership

 Looked at annually, and if met, qualifies for funding through the state.



Variable: Service Levels

- Financial implication
- Safety potentially
- Community expectation
- Does it create enough savings to help?
- Does it create inequities?
- Shuttles?
