HOME BASED INSTRUCTION ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS
TO PARTICIPATE IN SPORTS

- I. WASHINGTON INTERSCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION
 - A. Meet eligibility requirement standards required of all other students;
 - B. Meet and adhere to the same team responsibilities and standards of behavior and performance as other members of the team/squad;
 - C. Participate as a member of the public school that the student would normally attend;
 - D. Provide to the school administration acceptable documentation of "full time attendance" academic achievement standards, and any other interscholastic eligibility standards required of all other student participants;
 - E. Comply with Washington Interscholastic Activities Association and local school district regulations during the time of participation;
 - F. Participates in an approved Home Based Instruction in compliance with RCW 28A.225; and
 - G. Provide to school authorities all required forms and provisions.
- II. DISTRICT—High School
 - A. Present copy of previous semester's transcript;
 - B. Complete athletics eligibility packet available in the high school main office (blue for return athletes/yellow for new athletes). This packet includes statements and signature boxes related to the following:
 - 1. Rules and Regulations (athletic code);
 - 2. Insurance Waiver (parent signature required). Athletes without insurance are required to purchase school insurance. A separate packet for purchase of insurance is available in the main office;

3. Entrustment of Care of Minors (parent signature required);
 4. Eligibility Statement (student signature required);
 5. Parent Permission Statement (parent signature required);
 6. Risk Statement (student & parent signature required);
 7. Medical History Information (parent signature required);
 8. Current Doctor's Physical (physician's signature required);
- C. Purchase ASB card;
- D. Have no current fines.
- III. DISTRICT—Middle School
- A. Purchase school insurance or sign insurance waiver;
 - B. Complete Physical Examination form;
 - C. If requested by staff, complete Athletic Evaluation Form;
 - D. Complete Risk Care Student/Emergency Information Form; and
 - E. Purchase ASB card.
