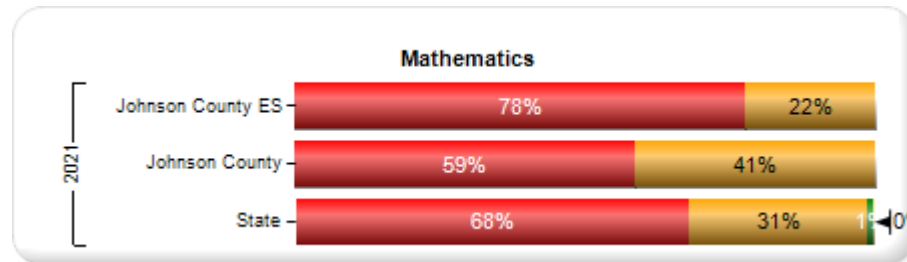
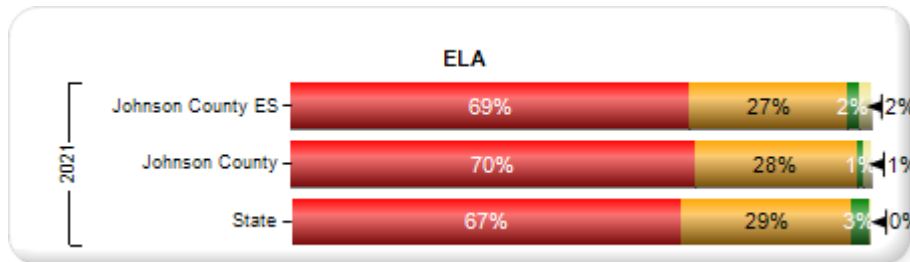
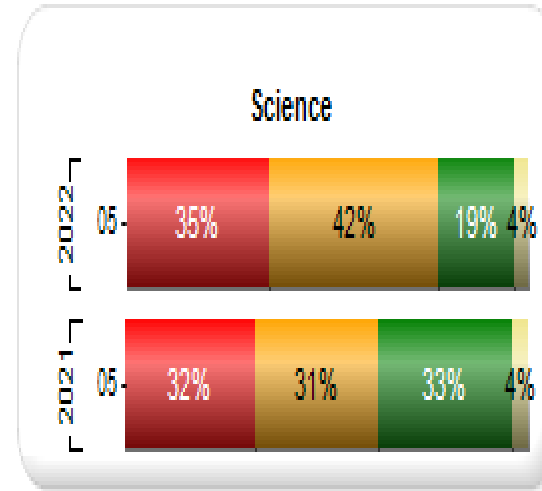
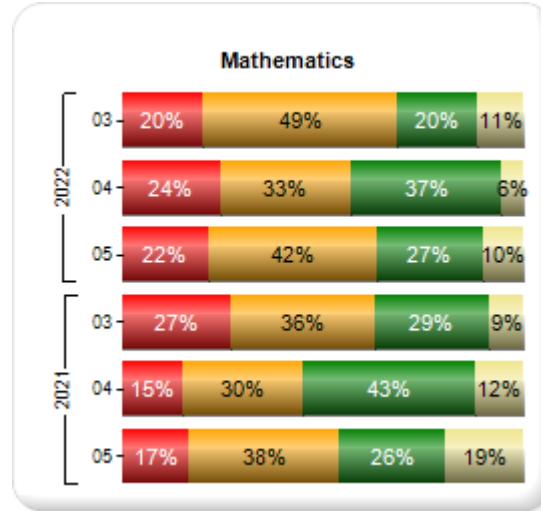
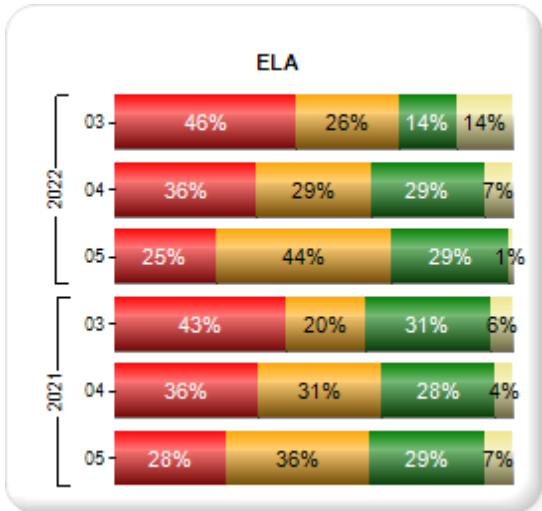
# Johnson County Schools Population Demographics

- ▶ Students with Disabilities (SWD) - 13.2%

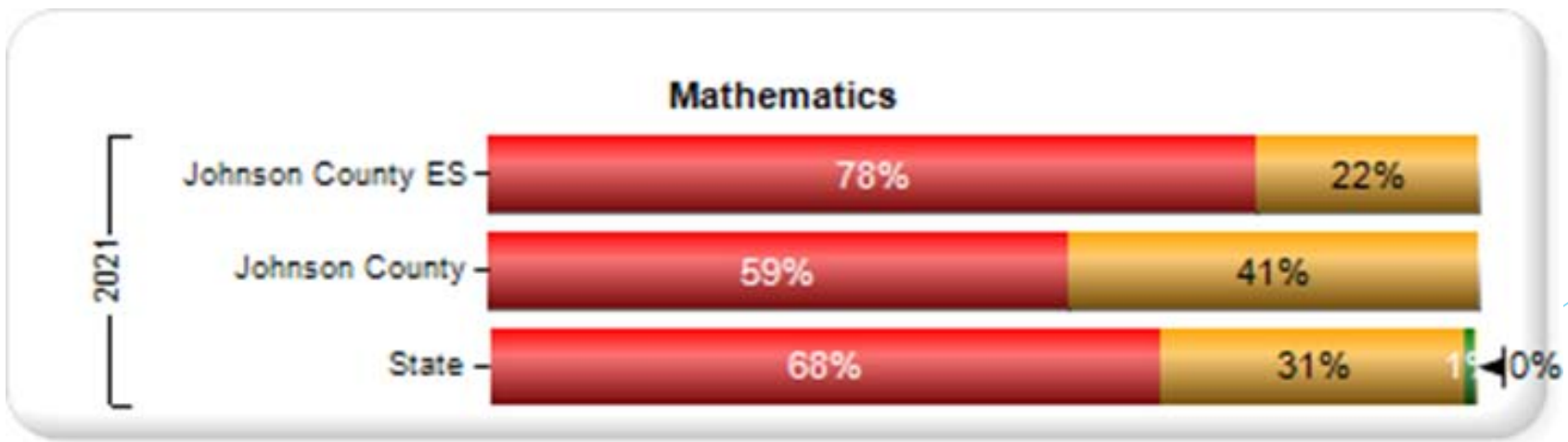
# CCRPI Data

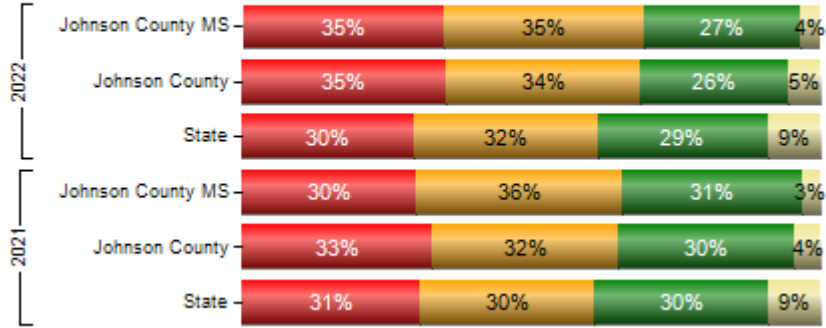

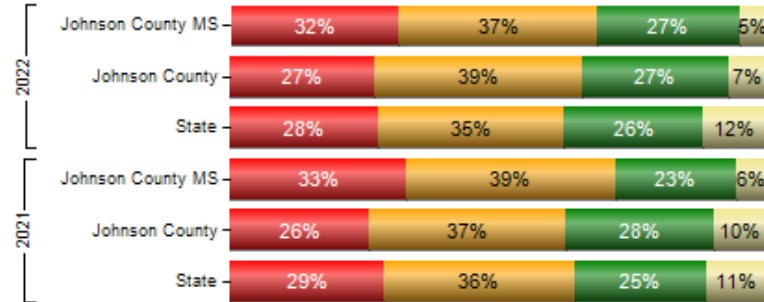

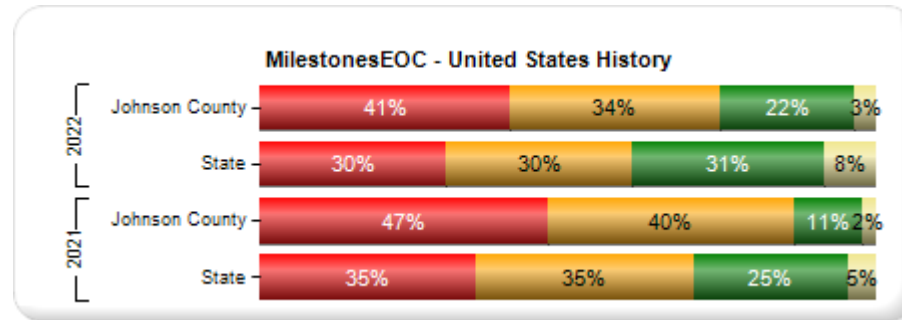
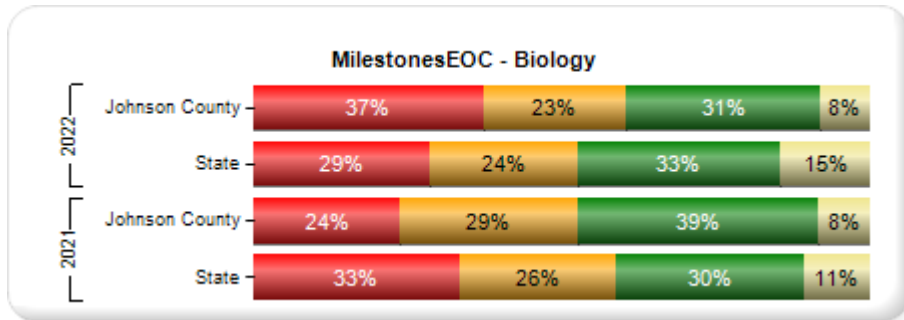
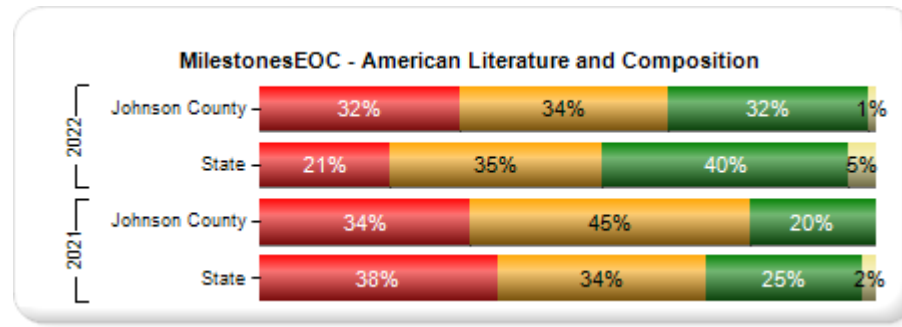
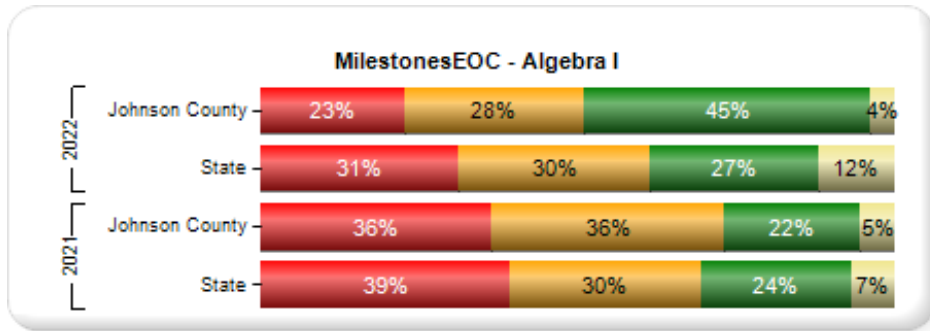




# 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Retest Results

# District Improvement Plan (CLIP) Goals

- ▶ **Goal 1: Effective Leadership/Parent & Family Engagement**
- ▶ By the end of 2024, create an organizational structure with stakeholder engagement which will provide systems to increase literacy, Math, and Science (CTAE) data by 3% as measured by the GMAS. (Literacy in community focused on STEM Equity).

# District Improvement Plan (CLIP) Goals

- ▶ **Goal 2: Coherent Instructional System:**
- ▶ By the end of 2024, increase student achievement data in math, science, and social studies by 3% as measured by the GMAS (targeting levels 3 and 4).  
(Minimize Learning Loss, Tier 1)
- ▶ Practices, small group instruction based on FI, grading practices).

# District Improvement Plan (CLIP) Goals

- ▶ **Goal 3: Supportive Learning Environment:**
- ▶ By the end of 2024, improve the student learning environment resulting in a 3% on “whole child” data and the CCRPI. (PBIS, MTSS, & SEL).

# Johnson County Schools Action Plan

## Next Steps

- ▶ Implement a School and Districtwide Safety Plan with the Georgia Emergency Management Agency (GEMA) through the Department of Homeland Security.
- ▶ Revise the Literacy Plan
- ▶ Develop a more comprehensive strategic plan with a balanced scorecard
- ▶ Ensure the recruitment and retention of Professional Qualified (PQ) staff for all positions in the district.
- ▶ Hire a full time Director of Student Services with primary focus regarding MTSS, SEL, and PBIS.
- ▶ Ensure that the campus is safe and drug free.
- ▶ Coordinate with law enforcement, city, and council officials.
- ▶ Provide Civilian Active Shooter Training for all district employees



# NEXT STEPS

- ▶ Have monthly budget meetings to keep abreast of finances
- ▶ Be proactive with the media by giving periodic press releases, updating information on social media sites, and informing the public regarding school-related events.
- ▶ Consider districtwide COGNIA accreditation (JCHS is currently the only school with COGNIA accreditation).
- ▶ Increase the number of certified staff with Reading Endorsements
- ▶ (We have a cohort of several staff members participating in training).
- ▶ Add a Elementary School Resource Officer in the district.
- ▶ Recruit a Part-Time ESOL Coordinator for the district.
- ▶ Continue to recruit Math and ELA interventionists to provide instructional support to academically struggling students.

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
