Through a variety of universal and specialized supports, students can feel more confident with their learning at WIC. Supports include:

Universal Supports:

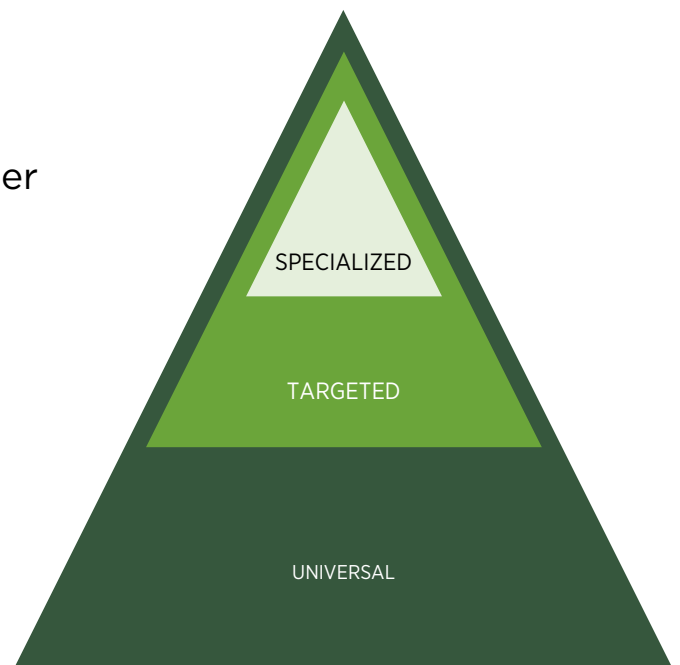
- Test centre
- Extra help with classroom teacher
- SSC drop-in
- Peer tutoring
- Student referral

Targeted Instruction:

- Learning strategies sessions
- Academic Counselling
- Socio-emotional counselling

Intensive Intervention:

- Recommendations from psychologists
- Regular counselling sessions
- Referrals to outside professionals

POST-SECONDARY ADVISING

TIERED APPROACH

Post-Secondary Advising assists Senior High students through developmentally appropriate programs, information and counseling with regards to understanding and planning for post-secondary education.

Examples of Universal Supports

- One-on-one post-secondary consultation with every senior student
- Access to resources for students, such as Canvas, MyBlueprint, external publications, scholarship information, summer programs, and other guidance materials
- Wolfpack Chat speaker series is available for students and families looking to gain insights from people in a variety of careers and general post-secondary application advice.
- Assist students with searching for post-secondary scholarships and applications
- Opportunity for students to attend both virtual and in-person presentations for various universities around Canada and the world
- Assistance with the application process to Canadian and international universities and colleges, including guiding students with supplemental documentation and essays for applications
- Annual university tour in November to various locations in Quebec, Ontario, and/or the Maritimes

Examples of Targeted Supports

- Support the development and implementation of IPPs for grade 12 students
- Help connect grade 12 students with IPPs with Student Services departments at the post-secondary institution they will attend in the fall
- Regularly scheduled check-ins with a post-secondary advisor regarding applications, scholarships, etc.
- Myers-Briggs Type Indicator assessment and debrief for students who would benefit from this support • Communicate with universities on behalf of students when required
- Coordinate and write required references to support the university and scholarship applications

Specialized Support

- Assist SSC with students experiencing critical events related to transitioning from WIC to university.
