What is the DELF exam?

The Diplôme d'études en langue française (DEL F) is a certification of French-language abilities for non-native speakers of French administered by the International Centre for French Studies for France's Ministry of Education.

In 2022, the DELF examinations are available in 175 countries.

DEL F and DAL F evaluate language skills in four areas:

- 1.oral comprehension,
- 2.oral expression,
- 3.written comprehension,
- 4.written expression.

The FLA and Études sociales Program of Studies show that they prepare our students for the completion of the B2 level.



Why take the DELF exams?

Approved by a team of psychometricians specializing in evaluations, the DELF examinations:

- Are recognized around the world;
- Add extra value to a resume;
- Are often used by administrative bodies, employers, and educational institutions; and
- Have been taken by more than 65,000 Canadians over the past few years.

Attaining a B2 level on the DELF offers many benefits to students:

- Many Canadian universities and universities in French-speaking countries recognize a B2 level for university entrance; and
- A number of international companies and federal government positions recognize the B2 level as proof of bilingualism.

These exams have proven to be very successful at WIC in encouraging French Immersion students to continue their university studies in French, as it officially recognizes their efforts in learning a second language.

WIC students can write the DELF exams in November and April of each school year.
