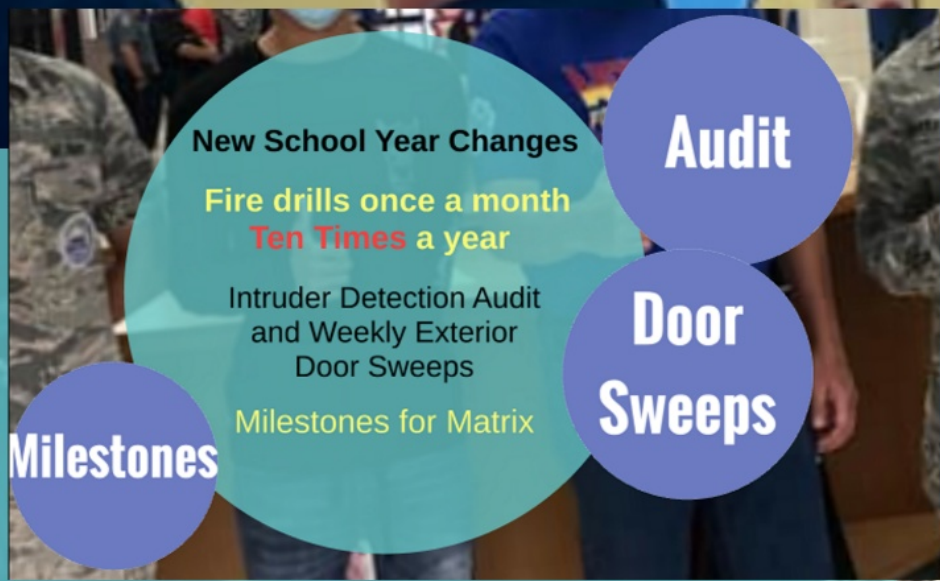

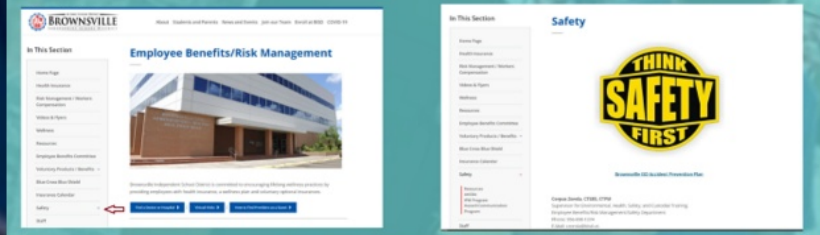

Safety Coordinator's Role and Responsibilities

Name: _____ Campus: _____

I recognize that the nature of an **Accident Prevention Program** is contingent and dependent upon support from the executive level of management down to the involvement of all employees of the District. I will make every effort to assist the District in providing a working environment free from any recognized or potential hazards. I am aware that all management and supervisors will act as examples of commitment to safety and health in the District.

I acknowledge the following safety documentation: Fire Drills, Fire Evacuation Plan, Campus Safety Inspection & Work Request Program, which may be required every month. Campus Safety Inspections coincide with state or district fire drills. Inspections, however, January, March, and April. Additionally, the forms must be posted within the TIA/ISO file system and a hard copy must be filed within any campus or department. If changes are made to this requirement, I will be notified at Safety Coordinator's meetings.

Fire Drill - A minimum of five (5) fire drills are required per semester (one (1) per school year, one month during the (10) school days or more, as directed by the Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §§103.1200. During two (2) fire drills in one month will not be substituted for a month in which no fire drill was held.

Fire Evacuation Log - All fire evacuations must be checked on a monthly basis. The supervisor's name, date of inspection, and stamp of each evacuation must be noted during the Month of August this May.

Safety Inspection and Work Request Form - Monitor of September, November, January, March, and April.

Safety Meeting - Every staff member on your campus or department must receive safety meeting information on the months that are required. All signs on charts must have the date, presenter's name, topic, and signature of all employees. All Campus Department Safety documentation is to be posted within the TIA/ISO - Campus Department Safety Coordinator profile file system to date end of each semester/academic. Having a Safety Meeting on a month that was not required will not be substituted for a month that was needed.

Employee's Fire Report of Injury - This is to be submitted to the Employee Benefit/Risk Management Department within 24 to 48 hours of an accident or near miss accident and submitted to the Employee Benefit/Risk Management Department. Email to: safetycomp@bisd.net.
