

College Board Accommodations

Extended Time

7

Approval to test for longer than the standard testing time, such as time and one-half (+50%).

Breaks

 \rightarrow

Additional breaks or longer breaks than those given during standard test administration.

Reading and Seeing Accommodations

 \rightarrow

A human reader, prerecorded audio (MP3 via streaming), large-print test, magnification device, and braille with raised line drawings.

Recording Responses



If a disability impacts the student's ability to record responses for College Board tests, there are several accommodations available.

Assistive Technology



Use of an electronic magnifying machine, screen reader, speech-to-text, electronic or talking calculator, or similar technologies.

College Board "CB" Takeaways

- Accommodations requests are first submitted & THEN students register for a test.
- Approval takes up to 8 weeks & requires specific documentation.
- Accommodations requests are usually submitted
 Spring-Summer of 10th grade so in place for 11th grade PSAT (in Oct. with submission deadline in August)
- Once an accommodation request is approved it applies to all tests moving forward for PSAT, SAT & Advanced Placement.
- What you need to know about your child's accommodations!



Documentation Guidelines

- To ensure approval for accommodations, a student's request should meet ALL of the following criteria:
 - The disability is documented by formal testing completed by a certified evaluator
 - The disability directly affects performance on CB's assessments
 - The requested accommodations are specifically needed to perform to potential on CB's assessments
- Students may be approved for accommodations on specific sections of the test rather than the entire test.

College Board

Testing within the last 5 years. Visual disabilities must be within 2 years. Other medical or psychiatric conditions must be the last year.

How to Submit an Accommodations Request?

Complete the College Board Consent Form for Accommodations Request

*Student & Parent Signed!

Make sure we have your full documentation & your student has been using the accommodation being requested.

We will submit the request & let you know when a decision posts.

Sometimes you'll get notice before us so let us know if you hear something

& we can pull your letter for you.

Accommodations Approved


- College Board sends you an approval letter that has an SSD number listed in the upper left corner. Keep the letter!
- Use the SSD Number when registering for a test to link the accommodations. If you already registered without the SSD number, contact College Board's SSD office at (212) 713-8333 for assistance.

Accommodations Denied

- College Board sends you a detailed denial letter.
- The denial letter will include very specific reasons & what additional support it needs to approve the request.
- Submit new or additional documentation for consideration, but know that it can take an additional 7 weeks from the date of receipt to make a decision.

Registration Ticket

If you've registered for an upcoming SAT administration, <u>sign into My SAT</u> and click the **Print Admission Ticket** drop-down menu item. This will open a new window where you can print your admission ticket or save it as a PDF. This will also tell you where you're registered to test.



Student's approved special testing accommodations will have the test center listed as School Based Testing. About a week before the test you'll get an email from our team with logistics on when/where we will be testing & with what to bring.
