

Campus Supervision Agreement 2022-2023

The EHK-12 self-supervision policy is that all students who are 11 years old or younger must have their primary educator (parent/legal guardian) on campus with them at all times. Under some circumstances, a parent may ask another family member or adult to supervise their child. This is not to be a regular occurrence. Students 12 and older may be on campus without a parent/legal guardian as long as they follow the Code of Conduct. If a student is not being safe, respectful, or engaged in learning activities while on campus, a staff member or the principal will work with the student and parent to come up with a different arrangement for learning.

When students have gaps in their schedule they should be focused on learning activities. They can do so in the library, computer labs, individual teacher rooms (with teacher permission), and other locations on campus suitable for studying or engaging in learning. While we support students in their social development, it should not be the primary activity of a student while on campus. Also, students should not be on campus for extended periods of time without a class to attend. In this case, students should be home or where their parents direct them to be.

Expectations:

- Parents/legal guardians will sign in at the office when they plan to remain on campus.
- Parents/legal guardians will supervise students' activity and behavior on the playground/playfields.
- Children who need more individualized, classroom support will be accompanied by their parent/legal guardian in the classroom.
- When parents/legal guardians are on campus, they can be quickly and easily found.
- Parents/legal guardians will use the sign-out procedure when transferring responsibility to another parent.
