



McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Services

If you have lost your housing due to a family crisis, unemployment, an eviction or financial issues, you may be eligible for services under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act which protects children and youth who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime accommodation by providing additional rights and educational support services.

You may be eligible for services if you are:

- Temporarily sharing housing with another family due to loss of housing or financial hardship
- In a motel or hotel due to lack of adequate accommodations
- In an emergency or transitional shelter
- In a car, park, campground, public space or abandoned building
- In substandard housing (e.g. housing that lacks electricity, water or heat)
- An unaccompanied youth who is not living with a parent/legal guardian and is experiencing homelessness

EAGLE College Prep, McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Program Services you may qualify for include:

- Assistance with immediate school enrollment
- Free breakfast & lunch
- Transportation to school
- school supplies
- Clothing
- Toiletry items
- Referrals to community agencies that assist with:
 - Housing
 - Food
 - Health Services
 - Immunizations
 - Counseling, etc.



Enrolling Students Experiencing Homelessness

EAGLE College Prep ensures that homeless children and youth enroll in, and have full and equal opportunity to succeed in our schools. The law requires that homeless students be enrolled immediately. Schools cannot refuse to enroll a homeless student for *lack of records (e.g., school records, transcript, IEP, MET, birth certificate or immunization records) or proof of a home address*. The McKinney-Vento law requires that homeless students be enrolled **immediately**. School personnel are to enroll and have students attend school while records are requested.

All educational services will be available for all of our students:

- English acquisition Services/ELL (if eligible)
- Migrant
- Counseling
- Special Education (if eligible)

EAGLE College Prep Schools
Education of Homeless Children and Youth
Dispute Resolution Process

If a dispute arises over school selection or enrollment in for a student eligible under the McKinney-Vento Act, Eagle College Prep Schools, shall be immediately admitted to the school in which enrollment is sought, pending resolution of the dispute. *Eagle College Prep Schools* will provide its share of the transportation to the school selected for the duration of the dispute resolution process.

The child, youth, parent, or guardian shall be referred to *Eagle College Prep School's* Local Educational Liaison, who shall carry out the dispute resolution process as expeditiously as possible after receiving notice of the dispute. In the case of an unaccompanied youth, the Local Educational Liaison shall ensure that the youth is immediately enrolled in school pending the resolution of the dispute.

The Local Educational Liaison shall work through the expedited dispute resolution process. For *Eagle College Prep Schools*, that process involves:

- A) Who – the Eagle College Prep School's Liaison will work with the administration and the student's parent or guardian, or in the case of an unaccompanied youth, directly with the homeless youth.*

- B) What – the Eagle College Prep School's will meet with the involved parties, review the substance of the dispute, and, if necessary, investigate the merits of the evidence presented.*

- C) When – within five (5) days of learning of the dispute, the Eagle College Prep School's Liaison will make a decision on enrollment of the homeless youth.*

Eagle College Prep School's shall provide the parent, guardian, or homeless youth with:

- 1) a written explanation of the school's decision regarding school selection or enrollment; and
- 2) written forms so that, if dissatisfied with the school's decision, the parent, guardian or youth may appeal the decision to the state level.
