

# Childhood



In the Childhood project, your child will learn words and phrases related to the passage of time. They will explore artefacts to help them to understand childhood in the past and how childhood has changed over time. They will explore the six stages of life and explore timelines and family trees. Everyday life in the 1950s will be explored, including shopping, transport, family life and childhood. They will also learn about the significance of Queen Elizabeth II's coronation in 1953 by studying photographs and online sources. The children will use maps to explore how places have changed over time and highlight any similarities or differences between childhood today and childhood in the 1950s. At the end of the project, they will create knowledge organisers for children who are about to study the topic of childhood.

Maths	White Rose Maths Autumn units –Place value, addition and subtraction and geometry.
English	Writing and reading skills based on the books Grandad’s Island and If All the World Were.
Science	<u>Everyday Materials</u> (Autumn 1) This project teaches children that objects are made from materials. They identify a range of everyday materials and their sources. Children investigate the properties of materials and begin to recognise that a material's properties define its use. <u>Human Senses</u> (Autumn 2) This project teaches children that humans are a type of animal, known as a mammal. They name body parts and recognise common structures between humans and other animals. They learn about the senses, the body parts associated with each sense and their role in keeping us safe.
Art	<u>Mix It</u> (Autumn 1) This project teaches children about basic colour theory by studying the colour wheel and colour mixing. It includes an exploration of primary and secondary colours and how artists use colour in their artwork. <u>Funny Faces</u> , <u>Fabulous Features</u> (Autumn 2) This project teaches children about the concept of the portrait and how the collage technique can be used to make a portrait.
DT	<u>Shade and Shelter</u> -This project teaches children about the purpose of shelters and their materials. They name and describe shelters and design and make shelter prototypes. Children then design and build a play den as a group and evaluate their completed product.
RE	<u>Christianity</u> -The Creation Story and The Christmas Story
