Founded in 1919, Lakeside School is a highly selective, coeducational, independent, nonsectarian day-school serving students in grades 5-12. Robust academic and extracurricular programs offer students a deep foundation in the liberal arts through critical inquiry and writing, project-based learning, and experiential education. Through a Lakeside education, students become strong unstructured-problem solvers, communicators, and collaborators who engage learning and the world around them with an ethical, equitable, and inclusive mindset.

Equity & Inclusion, Ethical, Global, Growth & Learning, Healthy, Service, Sustainability




AFTER LAKESIDE
