This month, classroom families spent time learning about our and others' feelings. The students participated in a variety of activities to boost skills to help students recognize and deal with their emotions. We built up skills to recognize that not everyone reacts to situations in the same way, and we can use clues to predict how people might react in a situation. Other activities helped students learn to regulate their emotions and understand the connection between thoughts and feelings. Self-talk skills help people switch unhelpful thoughts and feelings. Students also worked on having a growth mindset, knowing as time passes, interests and strengths change. Just because we cannot do something now, does not mean we will never be able to do it.

We will continue to strengthen our understanding and regulation of our feelings throughout the year.
