Rank

Class rank is determined by the weighted GPA semester averages achieved in all high school credit courses a student takes. All grades earned through the fourth quarter of the senior year will be used to determine the cumulative GPA.

Grade Point Average (GPA) Calculation

All high school level subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. High school-level courses taken in middle school are included. A minimum of 27 credits including 4 credits of Biblical Studies are required for graduation. Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment classes are weighted by 1 extra point towards GPA and Honors classes are weighted an extra .5 points. GPA and Class Rank are computed once per semester in January and May.
