SSPPS is proud to announce that two South St. Paul seniors have successfully graduated with three diplomas this year!

Kelton Holsen and Logan Smith from the Class of 2016 earned a high school diploma, an IB diploma and a two-year Associate in Arts degree without stepping foot into college. By completing all IB diploma requirements and taking additional classes, an IB diploma candidate has the opportunity to earn an associate degree through Inver Hills Community College.

The partnership between SSPPS and Inver Hills Community College started in 2012. Since then, three South St. Paul seniors successfully graduated with three diplomas.

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

CAREER AND COLLEGE READINESS



Our district is excited to be expanding career and college readiness (CCR) opportunities for South St. Paul students.







Career Readiness



Partnering with the ISD 197 (West St. Paul, Mendota Heights, Eagan) and the Inver Grove Heights school district, the TriDistrict collaborative is sharing resources to hire a career coordinator who will oversee the day-to-day operations to expand CCR opportunities for all students.

The career coordinator will develop career pathways to help students explore careers and learn about the many ways to earn college credits, degrees, or job-ready certifications while in high school.





College Readiness

In addition to career readiness, the SSP School District remains focused on its current college readiness options for students which is still among the strongest pathways in the state:



THREE DIPLOMAS The SSP School District is still the only place in Minnesota where a student can earn three diplomas during high school: a traditional high school diploma, an International Baccalaureate diploma and a two-year Associate of Arts Degree, all which can be achieved without stepping foot onto a college campus or paying for college credits.

PROJECT LEAD THE WAY With the new Design Center at the Secondary building, we are expanding our Pre-Engineering curriculum (Project Lead the Way) to grades 6-10. The program creates integrated learning experiences, blending computer science, engineering, and more. Students engage in critical and creative thinking, building teamwork skills, and learning to try and try again when faced with challenges.

AVID The District is expanding the AVID program to include all students in grades 3-6. AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination. Students learn skills and behaviors for academic success, receive support with tutorials and strong student/teacher relationships, experience a positive peer group for students, and develop a sense of hope for personal achievement gained through hard work and determination.

1:1 MOBILE DEVICE SSPPS is proud to offer 1:1 mobile devices for students in grades 6-12 and one device for every two elementary school students to use in their classrooms. The SSP community supported devices and technology several years by voting to approve a \$500,000 technology levy in 2010. The District's technology initiative increases the effectiveness of personalized learning allowing students to learn at a pace that is comfortable and effective for them.

ALL DAY PRESCHOOL SSPPS is also proud to offer morning and afternoon Community Preschool classes for three and four-year-olds at both Kaposia Education Center and Lincoln Center Elementary.

Putting Kids First

We are committed to making decisions that put our students first.

This is most challenging with our budget because:

- State funding is not keeping pace with increasing educational costs, nor with inflation
- Our state property tax system penalizes South St. Paul for having low levels of commercial property - meaning our homeowners pay more than our neighbors to support schools
- We have one of the lowest levels of local property tax support for our schools in the area
- We have one of the highest levels of family poverty in Dakota County

As a result of our school district receiving this additional funding for early learning, South St. Paul Preschool families attending Lincoln Center will see reduced tuition prices and increased scholarships for all preschool classes! We are also able to offer more options and more learning time for ALL preschool-aged children across South St. Paul.

With a "Bus Buddy," four-year-olds could be eligible to take the bus to preschool in the morning. A Bus Buddy is a big brother, sister or friend who gets to bus at the same bus stops as your four-year-

Transportation Reminders

Students should be at their stops five minutes prior to the pick-up time listed on the bus pass. All students should be at their stop ready to load the bus at the designated stop time.

Become a Minnesota Reading Corps Tutor

Kaposia Education Center and Lincoln Center Elementary are recruiting Minnesota Reading Corps tutors for the 2016-17 school year. Tutors will be serving at Kaposia or Lincoln Center for 11 months.

These tutors play an important role in our students' learning. They work with students who need a boost to catch up at grade level in reading. They tutor each student daily for 15-20 minutes to build phonics, phonemic awareness and fluency skills. MN Reading Corps tutors are AmeriCorps members and do not replace teachers.
