COMMUNITY

Canandaigua, the ancient “chosen spot” of the Seneca Nation of the Iroquois Confederacy, is located at the north end of Canandaigua Lake in the beautiful Finger Lakes Region of upstate New York State. The City of Canandaigua has a population of about 11,000. It is the county seat for Ontario County, the fastest growing county in the Rochester metropolitan area, located 26 miles southeast of Rochester and 5 miles from New York State Thruway exit 44. This allows for residents to be employed locally and in surrounding communities within the fields of light industry, business, trades and professions.

SCHOOL

Canandaigua Academy was founded in 1791 as a private academy for boys. Today it is a small, public city high school with a coed population of 1,094 students in grades 9-12. The 2022-23 senior enrollment includes 267 students.

COVID-19 Statement

Canandaigua students received in-person instruction through March 16, 2020 during the 2019-2020 school year. Students engaged in learning remotely due to the COVID-19 pandemic after that time for the remainder of the 2019-2020 school year. Final grades placed on student transcripts were generated from a locally developed grading rubric that emphasized student performance from the first 25 weeks of the school year. For the 2020-2021 school year students were hybrid where they received synchronous instruction 2 days a week and were asynchronous 3 days a week. In addition, Regents exams that were scheduled to be administered are noted on the transcript with an “E,” which indicates “COVID-19 exemption”.
