MINUTES

A. Call to Order

The Regular Meeting of the Wayne County Regional Educational Service Agency Board of Education was called to order by Vice President Jackson on September 14, 2022 at 8:30 a.m.

Member Petrie, supported by Member Funderburg, moved to approve the agenda as presented. On voice vote, the motion carried 4-0.

E. Public Participation – None.

F. President's Remarks and Board Comments

Member Blackmon shared a reminder that the Shining Light Regional Cooperation Awards will be held Thursday, October 6, 2022, 7:30 a.m. at The Mint at Michigan First Conference Center, 27000 Evergreen Rd., Lathrup Village, Michigan 48076.

Vice President Jackson shared highlights from Wayne County Schools:

- **Ecorse:** Congratulations to Ecorse Public Schools for hosting a ribbon cutting ceremony for the Dr. Brenda J. Hague Early Learning Village on August 31, 2022. This is the district's new pre-k-kindergarten facility. RESA is excited about their early childhood expansion.
On August 26, Ecorse dedicated the Ecorse High School baseball field in honor of Vice President Jackson's husband and longtime Ecorse coach Curtis Jackson, Sr. who coached in Ecorse for 40 years. A baseball shirt signed by former players will be encased for display.
- **Gibraltar:** Kudos to Carlson High School Students Kira Lewis and Julia Stein who eagerly painted a mural at the Gibraltar Fire Department. The teens used the city of Gibraltar logo, as well as the Maltese cross as a symbol of the Fire Department as their starting point, and then used their creativity to include elements of the Detroit River that include waves at the bottom of the mural, a lighthouse, and geese in flight.
- **Grosse Ile:** Congratulations to Cecilia Lind who was interviewed by WDIV Channel 4 news as one of 15 students to be selected to participate in a STEM Flight Program for women in aviation in Ypsilanti at Willow Run Airport.

- **Van Buren:** On Sunday, September 11, Belleville High School, along with the Belleville Arts Council, hosted Art in The Parking Lot with over 100 painted student parking spots on display. Kudos to the Bellville High School students.
- **Wayne-Westland:** John Glenn High School celebrated their 2022 Student-Athletes of the Year, Katelyn Donahee and Joseph Nunez, at the first home football game. Katelyn attends Eastern Michigan University, and Joseph is attending the University of Michigan.
- The Wayne RESA Board of Education wished all districts and public school academies an outstanding 2022-2023 school year!

- Wayne County Special Populations – Sabrina Rudy, Special Populations Consultant, provided a summary of Special Populations services, leadership and professional learning, regional grant coordination and Wayne RESA's collaboration with Michigan Department of Education, Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and other community based programs and organizations.
- Wayne RESA Website Updates – Kyle Gnagey, Web Developer, LMS, and Communications Coordinator, presented Wayne RESA website updates that includes Wayne County Schools data, the Wayne RESA Annual Services Report and information regarding the Regional Enhancement Millage.
 - Member Funderburg suggested that the Wayne RESA website updates be presented to the Wayne County Association of Schools Boards as a resource for constituent districts.

I. Communications – None.

J. Superintendent's Report

Executive Director of Legislative Affairs Mike Latvis

Mr. Latvis shared the following updates:

- Legislators are working on a General Fund Supplemental that would include \$141 million in Federal Cares money that need to be appropriated by the end of September.
- The new retirement law has posed some immediate challenges due to the 9 month bona fide termination stipulation.
- The School Aid Fund is \$225 million above projection for the current fiscal year.
 - School safety and mental health will be considered as long-term budget items.

- Guidance is expected soon for House Bill 6012 that fully funds risk assessments and critical incidence mapping to help protect students and create safety plans in the event of an emergency. The Bill also fully funds resources to hire and retain mental health professionals, enhance security measures, and provides additional learning opportunities for Oxford Community Schools. Districts will receive a memo and action will be required by October 1.
- Member Petrie inquired about the status of the DeVos Voucher Campaign.
 - 500,000 signatures were submitted.
 - K-12 Alliance, Michigan Association of Superintendents and Administrators (MASA), and Michigan Association of Schools Boards (MASB) are planning campaign opposition.

Associate Superintendent of Educational Services Beth Gonzalez

Ms. Gonzalez shared the following updates:

- Wayne County has expanded access to the Great Start Readiness Program (GSRP) for 4 year olds:
 - 12 programs have been added with an additional 192 students.
 - The County increased classrooms from 545 to 602 this year, with over 10,000 students having access to free Pre-K through GSRP.
 - The Early Childhood team is also working with MDE to expand eligibility.
- Summer Lit Labs were expanded this year to include 13 districts at 50 sites with over 3,000 students. 60,000 books were issued to students and families. The program also expanded to include rising kindergarteners. RESA partnered with 6 districts at 40 sites with over 800 rising kindergarteners participating. 4,800 books were issued to students and families.
- RESA offered summer professional learning opportunities which included a series of topics with 37 distinct offerings. There were 1,200 registrations and published recordings have received over 1,300 views.

Assistant Superintendent of Human Resources Kelly Bohl

Ms. Bohl shared the following updates:

- The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) streamlined its COVID-19 guidance in recognition of the many tools now available to reduce COVID-19 severity, significantly lessening the risk of severe illness, hospitalization and death compared to earlier in the pandemic. Based on the recent changes Wayne RESA made significant changes in the Wayne RESA COVID Preparedness and Response Plan. Visiting Guidelines was also added to the Contact Us page on the RESA website.

Deputy Superintendent Steve Ezikian

Mr. Ezikian shared the following updates:

- Recent changes to the Act 18 fund budget to support transportation programs was discussed. Board recommendations will be forthcoming.
- Details regarding the action item for Building Use and Rental Charges was shared and it was noted that the item was included on the current agenda for vote.
- Discussions and planning regarding the Beacon Day Treatment Program continue. Updates will continue to be provided.

Superintendent Dr. Daveda Colbert

Dr. Colbert provided the following updates:

- Congratulations to Garden City and River Rouge School Districts for the passing of their Millage Proposal Renewals during the August 2nd primary election.
- Wayne County Districts have had successful openings of school for the 2022-23 school year. RESA has provided professional development, technical assistance, and one-on-one support as needed, as well as, in district support for those who needed assistance maintaining continuity of services for students and support for staff. RESA continues to seek feedback from superintendents on meeting their immediate and specific needs, and the services RESA provides.
 - Districts have continued to share areas of focus for the 2022-23 which include: improving attendance rates and decreasing chronic absenteeism, improving literacy and math outcomes, increasing graduation rates, providing social emotional support for students, as well as, staff well-being, and school safety. Superintendents are also hopeful for a school year without disruptions to the learning environment.
 - Wayne County Schools will continue to encourage vaccinations as a best practice to keep school environments safe.
- RESA is involved in statewide Grow Your Own planning; Beth Gonzalez is part of the team developing a collective model for the state. Local districts are also in planning stages for developing their own programs. Wayne-Westland has partnered with Eastern Michigan University, Wayne County Community College District, Davenport University, Schoolcraft Community College, and Madonna University to discuss a Grow Your Own Program. A meeting is scheduled September 29 and RESA will be in attendance as a partner to Wayne-Westland in their efforts.
 - Member Blackmon inquired about data regarding home schooling. Dr. Colbert shared that the data is not available, but home schooling did grow from the pandemic and remains prevalent due to school safety and curriculum concerns.
 - Member Funderburg inquired about the supports RESA offers to districts in the midst of the staffing shortage and the impact on RESA staffing. Dr. Colbert shared that this topic is included in RESA planning discussions and expressed her appreciation for the RESA staff and the expertise they bring to the organization.
- 2022 Wayne County M-STEP Data, which will include the Read By Grade Three performance data will be presented during the October RESA Board of Education meeting.
 - Member Petrie inquired about the increase of the number of 3rd grade students retained due to the Read By Grade Three Law. Dr. Colbert shared that the October presentation will take a deep dive into the data.
- As part of a September communication that was forwarded to RESA staff, the somber anniversary of 9/11, National Hispanic Heritage Month (September 15 – October 15), and Deaf Awareness Month were recognized.
- Dr. Colbert, Michael Latvis and Wayne County Superintendents attended a dinner with U.S. Army Chief of Staff Gen. James McConville in August. A follow up meeting is scheduled with the RESA Team September 15 to discuss military options for Wayne County students, which includes participating in the March to Success experience to

prepare them to successfully compete on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) enlistment test.
