State Testing Incentive

3. Must come prepared with appropriate materials for testing
4. Must use paper to work out math problems and organize writing.
5. Must work the minimum time on the test. Teachers will share minimum work times with the students.
6. Must maintain appropriate behavior during testing sessions.

ISSUE 4: KNOW THE FACTS

WHAT IS A SUBSTITUTE LEVY?

A substitute levy is an option for the District to "renew" an expiring emergency operating levy, while allowing our schools to benefit from new construction. This process ensures that **all current property owners pay no additional taxes.**

WHAT LEVY IS BEING SUBSTITUTED?

The substitute levy will take the place of the \$1,835,000 emergency operating levy that first passed in May 2013 at 5.9 mills and will now show as 3.8 mills when calculated against current property values.

WHAT IS THE MONEY GENERATED BY THIS LEVY USED FOR?

This levy generates \$1,835,000 annually. The tax proceeds are used to fund general operating expenses (i.e. utilities, supplies, equipment, personnel, and contracted services, etc.).

WHY WAS IT ORIGINALLY CALLED AN EMERGENCY LEVY?

The levy naming comes directly from State law. An emergency operating levy is one type that can be legally used by Ohio school districts for general operating purposes. There is no specific emergency that relates to the levy.

WHAT IS THE LENGTH OF THE SUBSTITUTE LEVY?

The substitute levy is being requested for a continuing basis, so our schools can fiscally plan, preserve current programming and services for all students, and maintain day-to-day operations.

WHY A SUBSTITUTE LEVY?

Anticipating new residential construction within the District over the next few years, the Board of Education believes the substitute levy is the best option for our schools. Just like a straight renewal, there are no new taxes for our current property owners; however, the substitute levy allows our schools to benefit from the upcoming new residential construction.
