Notre Dame is a co-ed, college-preparatory high school that prepares students for a life of **FAITH, SCHOLASTIC SUCCESS, and COMMUNITY**. Since our founding in 1956, our private, Catholic campus welcomes all students and centers around our charism: *Cor Unum et Anima*—One Heart and One Spirit. Recognized as an **Apple Distinguished School**, Notre Dame utilizes a one-to-one iPad learning environment to encourage students to innovate beyond the classroom. Our community is focused on developing and encouraging a culture of exploration, and providing students with opportunities to apply their learning in real-world environments on their journey to create, learn, and grow.

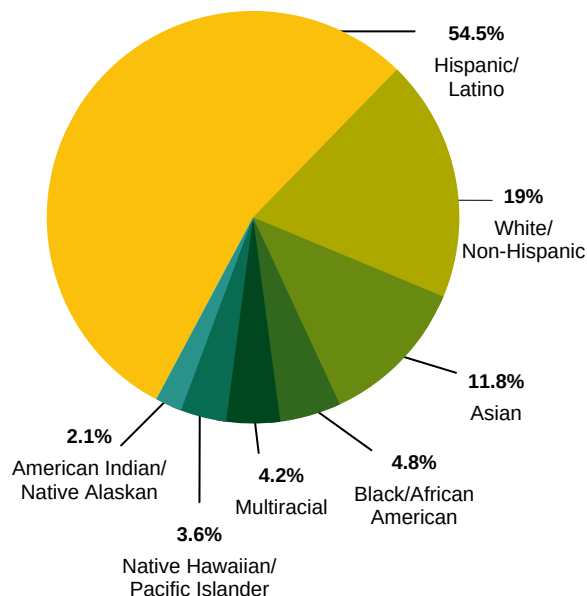

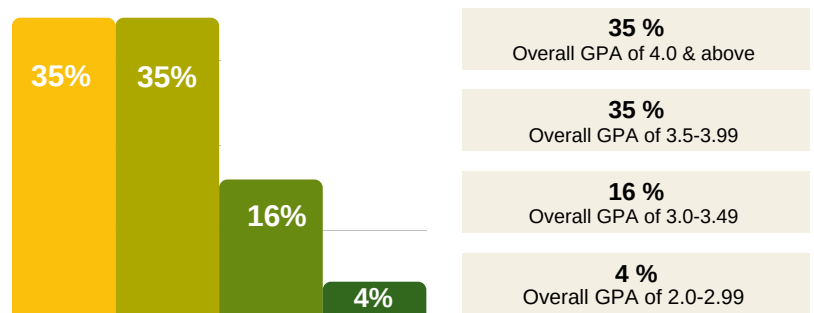

EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY

Notre Dame's educational technology is designed to guide students to become resourceful, creative, and responsible digital citizens. Over 90% of the teachers, staff, and administrators are Apple Teacher Certified after completing a professional development program designed to build Apple product skills and tech integration in the classroom. Notre Dame's technology program allows our teachers and tech staff to monitor iPad use both on and off-campus to ensure that students utilize technology responsibly. All students are provided with a school-issued iPad, a school email account, and a personalized ebook shelf. Each student and parent also have access to our learning management system (LMS) Canvas, through which they can receive and submit assignments, view their grades, and communicate with their teachers and peer.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

ATHLETICS

Notre Dame offers 17 different CIF team sports in the fall, winter, and spring seasons. Team tryouts are held during each season, with opportunities for students to participate in multiple sports. In 2021, six of our teams earned the "Highest Team GPA" in Riverside County.

ENGAGEMENT LEADERS & STUDENT AMBASSADORS

Engagement Leaders and Student Ambassadors serve as the "welcoming committee" on campus. Engagement Leaders assist new students in adjusting to high school or transferring to Notre Dame and seek to increase engagement and connection on campus. Ambassadors partner with prospective students and families and support surrounding partner schools.

ASB & PEER MINISTRY

ASB and Peer Ministry students encourage campus engagement and faith formation through activities and retreats. ASB (Associated Student Body) hosts clubs, events, dances, etc., and is appointed through class voting. Peer Ministers lead campus retreats, Masses, and other faith-based events. Peer Ministry students must be accepted through an application process.

CLUB & ACTIVITIES

Notre Dame provides many opportunities to get involved; more than 85% of our student population participates in at least one club, athletics, or other campus activity. Students can join existing clubs and activities or even petition to start a new one. Some of our most popular clubs include— Environmental Club, Key Club, Video Game Club, Hispanic Club, and Anime Club.

ENVIRONMENTAL CLUBS

Through community clean-up projects, weekly recycling, and on-campus beautification projects, Notre Dame environmental club students are able to make a direct impact on our campus and the greater community.

PERFORMING ARTS

Students interested in performing arts can participate in theater, choir, and church band. The Notre Dame Theater Guild hosts three major performances each year, including the Student-Directed One Acts. Students involved in the choir and church band perform at Mass and other community events.

VISUAL ARTS

Visual Arts students bring a unique perspective to campus life through photography, digital art, traditional art, and textile design. A variety of student art has been featured in local art competitions and college showcases.

MOCK TRIAL

Since its start in 2017, the Notre Dame Mock Trial Team has been tremendously successful as a program. Coached by ND Alumni, the team has earned "Elite 8" placement in the Riverside County Mock Trial Competition annually since 2018 and placed first in the county in 2022.

Mock Trial students have been named best Clerk and Pre-Trial Attorney during competitions and have even obtained internships with the Riverside County District Attorney's office.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ADMISSIONS

International students are an integral part of the Notre Dame community. While abroad, students can thrive academically and socially through campus clubs, athletics, and the arts. Notre Dame is a catalyst for international students to pursue their college ambitions within the United States. Our program allows for international exploration within a safe environment during their time at Notre Dame. International students are invited to apply for admission starting freshman year with transfer opportunities sophomore through senior year.
