WHO WE ARE

The Grauer School, founded in 1991, is a grades 7-12 independent, relationship-driven, college preparatory day school with approximately 160 students in attendance. Nestled on six green acres in the coastal community of Encinitas just five miles north of the San Diego city limit, Grauer serves students from surrounding communities as well as international students. The Grauer Foundation for Education is a not-for-profit organization governed by a Board of Trustees.

MISSION

We redefine what an independent school looks and feels like. As one of San Diego's leading life preparatory schools, The Grauer School's purpose is unique, research-driven, and simple – to teach and encourage students to become resourceful, intellectually curious, intrinsically motivated, self-advocating, and accountable in a compassionate, college preparatory environment.

FACULTY

At The Grauer School, 86% of our teachers possess advanced degrees, and Cum Laude is the norm. We attract teachers who have graduated with distinction from their universities, have a strong commitment to humanitarian service, and have had sustained international and intercultural experiences. With 35 certified personnel, including the Head of School, Principal, and Counselor, our teacher-to-student ratio is 1:7. This **small school advantage** enables the faculty to foster relationship-driven education and to cultivate an abiding intellectual curiosity in our students.

PARTNERSHIPS

Community partnerships have been fostered since Grauer's inception. Students work closely with the Surfrider Foundation and the Nature Collective on local coastal issues. Our sister school is Maui Preparatory Academy. We are an Associated School of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization. This designation establishes Grauer as one of 11 UNESCO Centers for Innovation in the United States and the only one in our region. The school campus has been awarded LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Gold status. We are a proud member of the Encinitas Chamber of Commerce, and the school taps deeply into our local community.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Grauer School's graduation requirements follow the University of California track (a-g requirements) and exceed California State Standards. Moreover, 50 documented hours of community service, ecological and humanitarian expeditions, and a capstone Senior Graduation Thesis Defense are required of our graduates.

Honors

Honors is our most rigorous course of study; **Grauer does not offer Advanced Placement (AP) classes.** To promote a balanced, holistic educational experience, students can enroll in a **maximum of three Honors courses per year** (unless they have petitioned our Leadership Team to add an additional course). Honors coursework is offered in almost all academic areas and must be approved by the department chair and the student's counselor. An Honors course will result in an additional point towards the student's GPA.

Honoring the traditions of **Socratic education**, students revise their work to ensure that they progress to the next level of complexity only when they have mastered the prior level to the degree of their own choosing. We recognize that students are individuals, and all are encouraged to maximize their talents and to persevere until they achieve success. Students may not revise summative assessments and comprehensive semester exams.

COVID-19 PANDEMIC E-LEARNING TRANSITION

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, The Grauer School provided e-Home virtual learning from March 2020 through October 2020. During this time, our grading scale remained the same and students attended synchronous, virtual classes from 9:00am-3:00pm daily. We offered local day trips to all students in lieu of our traditional expeditions, and we hosted important transitional experiences for our students virtually. From October 2020 through June 2021, most of our students returned to in-person on-campus learning, while a small number of students opted to continue e-Home learning. Since the beginning of the 2021-2022 school year, The Grauer School has been fully in-person and on-campus with no option for e-Home learning.



SENIOR GRADUATION THESIS DEFENSE

To verify that our students have grown into resourceful, compassionate individuals, every Grauer senior develops a comprehensive **Senior Portfolio** and makes an original, in-depth presentation to a panel of teachers, parents, peers, and administrators. The students are expected to demonstrate a level of scholarship and also articulate the core values they have internalized as Grauer students. Seniors may choose from the following for their thesis defense: The Arts, Global and Humanitarian Studies, Science & Technology, Ecological Studies, Expeditionary Education, Leadership Studies, Liberal Arts, Personal Health and Athletics, Social Justice & Activism and Other (By Petition).

EXPEDITIONARY LEARNING

Grauer was founded on a one-of-a-kind **Expeditionary Learning** program to enrich its college preparatory curriculum, in accordance with the school's motto "Learn by Discovery"™. Rooted in the philosophy that real-world engagement is critical to an authentic education, the program transports students around the community and the globe to immerse themselves in unfamiliar languages, cultures, and ecosystems for two full weeks or more per year. These cultural and humanitarian experiences are life-altering. Community service, the arts, geography, physical challenge, social interaction, and student reflection are all a part of the process in this widely emulated program.

CO-CURRICULAR ENRICHMENT

The Visual and Performing Arts department at The Grauer School allows students to discover their **passions and unique artistic talents**. With film studies & production, multimedia, music, photography, recording arts, studio art, theatre, and yearbook opportunities, a student's senses – and sense of accomplishment – can be awakened in a multitude of ways. 86% of Grauer students take advantage of our arts offerings.

An extraordinarily high percentage of Grauer students play sports and compete in inclusive athletic competitions. For our high school athletes, we partner with Horizon Prep in varsity and junior varsity sports sanctioned by the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF), Divisions 4 and 5. CIF sports offerings include basketball, cheer, cross-country, football, golf, soccer, tennis, track & field, and volleyball. Club sports also rotate throughout the year, including archery, sailing, surfing, yoga, and more.

Grauer provides a full range of **college preparatory STEM options**, including robotics, computer science, engineering design, environmental science, graphic design, and guitar building. **Grauer's Shockwave Robotics team members have been world-champion contestants five times.** Our math and science classes incorporate technology and engineering through project-based learning and student projects, providing hands-on opportunities that expand upon what they have learned in the classroom. We also believe in turning STEM into STEAM, incorporating "A" for Arts through collaborations with our arts programs.

The Grauer School's mission is to develop **compassionate citizens** as we collaborate with students in helping in their community, in nature, and around the world. Students participate in at least 50 documented hours of community, humanitarian or ecological service as they move through high school.

Student-run clubs are in regular development by petitioning students. Club offerings vary each year, including academic, athletic, and leadership opportunities.

STUDENT SATISFACTION: 99TH PERCENTILE NATIONWIDE

Grauer students participated in the **nationally-normed** Panorama Social Emotional Learning Surveys in the spring of 2022, along with thousands of other schools and students across widely diverse geographical areas across the nation. The surveys measure students' feelings about school, teaching, and learning. Grauer students responded to questions in these specific areas:

- School physical and emotional climate and safety
- Teacher-student relationships
- Sense of belonging
- Academic engagement
- Rigorous expectations

Overall, Grauer students surpassed their peers in all areas measured, and scored in the 99th percentile in their perceptions of school climate and safety, teacher-student relationships, and the value of school.
