A Committed Performer

However, Jericho excelled with the state champion Mesa Ridge winter guard and confidently applied to join The Cadets. He is currently a member of the color guard with Mesa Ridge's marching band.

Jericho credits the tremendous band and color guard staff at Mesa Ridge for helping him along his journey.

"The staff here is very caring. They push us to our limits but I know they want the best for us. They want to see how far we can go."

Much credit should go to Jericho himself, too, considering how his relatively little color guard experience didn't hold him back from making it into such a prestigious group as The Cadets. Much of his skill is self-taught from color guard videos he found online. He also regularly records himself doing flag routines and jots down his observations in a notebook, noting what he's done well and also how he can improve.

Jericho's future includes more color guard as he plans to audition for multiple drum corps groups for the 2023 competitive season. He also hopes to defend the championship trophy for the Mesa Ridge winter guard this upcoming season. As both a talented world class performer and as a kind, humble student, Jericho Cabrera hopes to translate his Grizzly Greatness into many more banner years of color guard to come!
