By signing below, I acknowledge that:

- The LIGHT Leadership Residency is a highly-selective post-baccalaureate program approved by PDE that requires both a two-year residency commitment (including compulsory participation in the LIGHT Leadership Summer Institute in late June/early July) and documented demonstration of leadership and fieldwork competencies to earn initial PK-12 Principal Certification.
- Applicants must currently hold a PA teaching or counseling certificate in good standing and have at least three years of full-time experience in a school.
- No application is complete without a signed Memorandum of Understanding.
- Eligible applicants will either be invited to participate in a Selection Day Event for Light Leadership Cohort 2025, or given feedback on their submissions to support re-application for a future cohort.
- Full tuition for the program is \$10,000 over two years. String Theory Schools does not provide financial aid, though you are free to pursue independent loans through your own financial institution to assist with tuition expenses.*
- Residents are responsible for all certification costs through the Pennsylvania Department of Education.
- Residents are responsible for any costs associated with anchor texts or other course materials. (Some texts are available at local libraries and/or electronically for no or low cost.)
