The Youth Apprenticeship program is a one- or two-year elective statewide program that combines academic and technical instruction with mentored, paid, on-the-job work experience in a chosen field. This program helps high school students (grades 11 & 12) prepare for careers while they are still in high school, developing the technical and job skills employers are looking for. Youth Apprentices work a minimum of 450 hours at the worksite each year of their program and take related high school or college classes to enhance their worksite experiences. Students must meet grade and attendance expectations and can earn elective high school credit each year they are in the program.

Nutrition Services

Negative Meal Account Reminders:

- School Messenger messages will be sent out to all households to let you know if your child's meal account balance is negative. Please send money with your child in a prepayment envelope that includes your child's name. This envelope can be given to the kitchen staff at your child's school. Please visit www.Paypams.com to create an online account for your child where you can add money to their meal account using a credit card as well as view purchases made.
- Middle School and High School: Ala carte privileges are suspended once the meal account reaches a negative balance. A reimbursable meal only may be charged on a negative account until the account reaches a negative \$20, at which time the student will need to bring a cold lunch meal from home until the negative balance is corrected or cash is brought in to pay for the hot lunch meal that day. No student eligible for a free or reduced meal may be denied a lunch, even if the student has a negative account balance greater than negative \$20.

Wausau East Library Receives Global Libraries Grant

The Wausau East Library proudly announces its receipt of the Global Libraries Grant through UW-Madison. In 2022, the Institute for Regional and International Studies (IRIS) created this grant opportunity to support K-12 student engagement with internationally themed texts. Applicants like the Wausau East Library were able to select up to 30 copies or titles from the thematic lists provided on the IRIS website. The lists have been curated by the Cooperative Children's Book Center (CCBC), School of Education, UW-Madison and include priority themes of migration, human rights, global health, climate, and global Islam. In total, 55 books were awarded to Wausau East with an approximate value of \$1000.

To honor the grant requirements, the East Library will be highlighting the new texts in the library for students to preview as well as sharing the list with East staff. Most of these books qualify for the completion of the Global Certificate offered here at East. Ms. Hase, the East librarian, will continue to search for and apply for funding that increases the diversity of the collection, meets curricular needs, and promotes independent reading.

NEWS FROM THE IB

THE PURPOSE OF THE UPCOMING INTERNAL ASSESSMENTS

The internal assessment is an integral part of each IB course and is mandatory for both SL and HL students. It enables students to demonstrate the application of their skills and knowledge and to pursue their personal interests, without the time limitations and other constraints that are associated with written examinations. The internal assessment skills are taught as a part of the regular classroom experience and could result in a research paper, portfolio, laboratory report, or oral commentary and presentation. Parents, it is important to understand the significance of this paper. In addition to being a major part of the student's IB grade, it is also a significant part of the class grade.

The internal assessment is graded by the student's teacher and is entered as a class grade in the teacher's grade book. This grade is often considered a major class assignment as the research skills are taught throughout the curriculum. However, IB requires that the papers from the students who will be testing in May be sent to them to evaluate how closely the instructor stays to the IB rubric; if the teacher grades too severely or too leniently, the examiner moderates the entire class's score to make sure the IB standards are maintained worldwide. These scores then become 20-30% of the student's final exam scores that are issued in July following the May exams.

It is important that parents communicate with their child so that they can keep track of the student's progress and help them meet the formative steps in the internal assessment process.

Health Services

IMPORTANT: If your child is feeling ill during the school day,

please have them report to the health office.

We will contact you to make arrangements for them to be picked up or sent home.



Information regarding your child and illness.

Please follow these guidelines from the Wausau School District for illness:

Masks are optional within the Wausau School District, so if you prefer to send your child to school with a mask, you are more than welcome to do that.

Here's what else you need to know:

- If your child is sick (COVID-19 or something else), keep them home.
- If your child is showing COVID-19 symptoms, we recommend they get tested.

We accept PCR, Rapid Antigen, and home tests.

- If the test comes back negative, they can return to school when they are fever free for 24 hours without medication and their symptoms are improving.
- If they test positive, we recommend that they quarantine for 5 days from their symptom onset.
 So what does that look like? The first day of their symptoms is considered DAY 0.
 Once 5 days have passed, they are then cleared to return to school on DAY 6.
 When they return, we recommend they wear a mask until DAY 10.

Reminder: All medication, prescription or over the counter, (i.e., ibuprofen, Tylenol, Tums, cold medication) must be kept in the health office during the school day. Students may carry emergency medication, inhalers and diabetic supplies. They also may carry cough drops, if needed.

Sophomore Conferences

On October 21, our department went into US History 2 classes and had students complete the Matchmaker, a career interest inventory. The Matchmaker, through a series of questions, identifies careers and career clusters that are good fits for students. The Matchmaker results will help guide students as they select their junior classes in January, which is right around the corner. If your child missed this activity on Oct 21, please have them stop in the Career Center.

In November, Counselors will be inviting sophomores and their parents to a Sophomore ACP Conference to review: Matchmaker results, transcripts, GPA, credits, and registration for junior year. At this conference, we will also start formulating a tentative post-secondary plan. This is the first step of many that counselors do in the ACP process to help students prepare for life after high school. Please watch for a letter pertaining to Sophomore Conferences to come home in November.

Financial Aid for College

In order to be eligible for federal loans, work study, or grants, students must complete the <u>Free Application for Federal Student Aid</u>. This is an online application that is required every year and submitted to the US Federal government. Once the application is received, the student's Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is determined and a Student Aid Report is generated. From there, the information is forwarded to the student's colleges of choice and the colleges respond with a financial aid offer for families to review for acceptance or denial. The Federal Student Aid office outlines 6 main steps to receive federal aid:



There are many resources to help students through the financial aid process. In October, East seniors and parents received an email outlining these resources.

If you still have questions regarding financial aid, feel free to contact the Financial Aid Office of the college you plan to go to or attend a College Goal Wisconsin event. College Goal Wisconsin events are completely free, where financial aid experts from area colleges are readily available to answer specific questions and walk you through completing the FAFSA. Please visit College Goal Wisconsin for more information and to register for an upcoming event: Nov 15 (at NTC).

ASVAB

On November 29, 2022, the **ASVAB** (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) will be offered at Wausau East. The ASVAB is a voluntary, free career aptitude test designed for students who plan to enter the military upon graduation **OR** for students who simply want to learn how their skills and interests match hundreds of occupations. The ASVAB assessment and interpretation will take approximately three hours. If you have questions or would like to sign-up, see Mrs. Gauger in the Career Center.

College & Military Visits

Representatives from colleges, universities and the military continue to visit the East Career Center throughout the year. Stop in to meet with the representatives and learn more about their post-secondary options. Students should check the <u>Career Center Events</u> for the most up-to-date information.



Selective Service

All males must register with Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. Students may register as early as three months after their 17th birthday. This is not a school requirement, it is the law. Failure to register will affect a student's ability to receive financial aid, job training or to gain citizenship. Registering with Selective Service is easy and only takes about two minutes. https://www.sss.gov/register/
