### The School

Farmington High School, established in 1882, is a 4-year comprehensive high school with a reputation for academic excellence and an emphasis on preparing its 1,271 students for college. The school challenges all students to participate in a wide variety of rigorous curricular and co-curricular opportunities. The school is accredited through the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. FPS is a National P21 Exemplar School District. The current senior class has 302 students.

### The Community

Nestled in the Farmington River Valley yet only 15 miles west of the state capital, Farmington provides its 4,280 students with the advantages of a small town as well as access to educational and cultural opportunities in the Hartford region and in nearby Boston and New York City.

### Curriculum

The Farmington Public Schools have developed a standards-based curriculum that defines what students are expected to know and be able to do at each grade level and in each discipline. Our standards are meant to prepare our students to be productive citizens in a rapidly changing world that demands critical thinking and problem solving.

### Academic and Extracurricular Highlights

- Activities:** Approximately 70% of all students were involved in the 80+ faculty sponsored clubs, various honor/service societies, in addition to 14 intramural sports and activities offered.
- Athletics:** Approximately 60% of all students were involved in the athletics program which offers 36 interscholastic sports.
- AVID:** Advancement Via Individual Determination is an elective program designed to prepare students for high school and college success.
- Capstone & ASPIRE:** This course aligns with our VOGC Experience and allows students to commit themselves to a challenging independent learning experience focused on a personal passion or a possible career. Students present their work publicly. Currently, we have 101 Capstone students in 12 different Capstone courses and 205 ASPIRE students in 21 different ASPIRE courses.
- Extended Learning Opportunities:** Opportunities include independent study, college partnership programs, internships, and specialized learning opportunities such as the Greater Hartford Academy of the Arts and Bristol Technical Education Center.
- Fine and Applied Arts:** Students in the arts engage in the real world application of materials and processes in fields ranging from construction to graphic design. Students engage in volunteer programs such as Habitat for Humanity and the Inter-district Mentoring Program. FHS art students are recognized in local art competitions, state-wide Scholastics competitions, and competitions such as Electrathon.
- Journalism:** The Voice, Farmington High School's student newspaper, was awarded the gold medal in the Columbia Scholastic Press Association's Medalist Critique three years in a row.
- Math:** Our team tied for first place in the New England Math Competitions in our region, which consists of 7 schools. The team was also recognized as a high scoring school in the New England Math League. A group of 5 students participated in the Mathematics Association of America (MAA) American Mathematics Competitions (AMC) at the national level and scored well enough to be invited to the American Invitational Mathematics Examination (AIME). Students also competed in MathCon at the local level and were invited to compete in the National MathCon Finals Competition where they earned an Honorable Mention.
- Music:** 89 FHS students were selected for the Northern Regional Music Festival and 33 for Connecticut All-State Music Festival. The FHS music program received the national award of "Best Communities for Music Education" and the state award of "CT Exemplary K-12 Music Program". Music school program partnerships with the Farmington Senior Center, UConn Music, Hartt School, HSO, Stanley Whitman House and the Hillstead Museum.
- Science:** All 9th graders take physics as part of our "Physics First" curricular sequence. Project Lead the Way is offered to students interested in engineering. Extracurricular activities include Robotics, Science Olympiad, and Science Bowl.
- Theater:** The drama department was nominated for 16 HALO awards and won 2.
- World Language:** All students meeting the WL graduation standard reach the Intermediate Oral Proficiency Level as defined by the American Council of Teachers of Foreign Languages (ACTFL). Students also have the opportunity to earn the Connecticut Seal of Biliteracy, demonstrating that they met their English Language requirements and reached at least an Intermediate-Mid Proficiency Level in Spanish or French.
