New Construction

Christ the King is in the final phases of construction on a \$6.7 million athletic and performance space, primarily funded by a successful Grounded in Faith, Building our Future Capital Campaign. The 21,800 square-foot Fulford Athletic & Activity Complex will include a full-size court and two cross courts in an expanded gymnasium, seating for up to 700 spectators, men's and women's locker rooms for home and visiting teams, and office space. It will also feature a full-size stage for student performances and school-wide events.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Everything Christ the King does begins with faith and ends with excellence. Each day, CTK helps students develop a strong foundation of Catholic values through prayer, study, and outreach. No matter the endeavor students choose to pursue, they graduate with a strong work ethic, a desire to achieve excellence, and a faith-filled heart to serve.

Helping students see the value in living a life of faith and service affords the foundation for their future as they enter the work world, grow their families, and interact with others in their communities.



Using a modified block schedule, the rigorous and challenging curriculum is taught by exceptional faculty who use cutting-edge technology to ensure students are prepared for the future. Students are provided with personal laptops to help integrate technology into each course of study. Advanced Placement (AP) classes and Honors courses are also available. The school also provides academic services for students who benefit from accommodations.

The Counseling Office supports students in the development of the skills needed to identify and process their personal, social, emotional, and academic profiles to navigate their life experiences. They accomplish this through academic planning, career planning, personal/social planning, and post-secondary planning.

CTK prepares students for the world ahead of them by allowing them to participate in a number of alternative curriculum Crusader Days. Students are offered classes in the liberal arts, as well as specialized areas such as philosophy, aviation, and glass works to name a few. Christ the King believes that by engaging students in the content they are studying, they build confidence, character, and provide experiences to set them apart, as they head off to college and enter the modern world.

FAITH LIFE AND DISCIPLESHIP

The mission of Campus Ministry is to invite the students, faculty, staff, and families into a life of discipleship with Christ the King. This discipleship involves believing sincerely, thinking critically, acting responsibly, and serving others in His name. Campus Ministry engages the CTK community through a variety of ways:

- Sacraments and Prayer: The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic faith. Campus Ministry provides opportunities to participate in the life of the Church, including daily Mass, prayer, spiritual devotions, and Confessions three times per week.
- **Retreats:** Students participate in grade-level retreats that provide a personal encounter with Jesus Christ. Retreats are a radical opportunity for students to grow in a relationship with each other and with God.
- **Service:** Students are required to complete 18 hours of service each year at CTK. They can join existing service groups and ministries or start their own service projects.
- Peer Ministry: Students can apply to serve as peer ministers who create
 a culture of authentic discipleship. Peer Ministers receive formation to
 follow Jesus and are encouraged to share the Gospel with their families
 and friends.

ARTS

The role of the Fine Arts Department of Christ the King Catholic High School is to challenge students to be the following:

Accomplished artists. Students will learn to expand on individual creativity through hands-on projects, incorporating the principles and elements of design or drama, demonstrating initiative and self-direction. Many of the beautification projects around the school are created by the students.

Critical thinkers. Students will use problem solving skills to promote innovation in the fine arts. Industrial Design students design and create full scale projects on the campus (such as the Cross on the hill in the background of the cover photo).

Interactive scholars of the world. Students will establish and understand the interconnectedness among each discipline in the context of our faith, especially through the introduction and analysis of Catholic works of art.

Competent Performers. Students have the option of participating in our band, guitar, voice, and musical performance programs.

ATHLETICS

CTK is a member of the North Carolina High School Athletic Association (NCHSAA) and competes in the Catawba Shores 1A Conference. CTK Athletics offers varsity teams in baseball, basketball, cheerleading, cross country, diving, indoor track & field, football, golf, lacrosse, soccer, swimming, tennis, track & field, and volleyball. CTK athletes also participate in club field hockey and club women's lacrosse.

The mission of the CTK Athletic Department is to provide student-athletes with as many opportunities to compete in interscholastic athletics as possible. Through sports, women and men build confidence, develop skills, and learn to value teamwork and sportsmanship. As St. Irenaeus said, "the glory of God is man fully alive."

In our short 10+ year history, CTK boasts 42 team and individual state championships. Since its first graduating class in 2015, CTK has had 29 athletes sign to play in college in a variety of sports, including golf, tennis, swimming, softball, baseball, baseball, and soccer.

CLUBS AND ACTIVITIES

At Christ the King, clubs and organizations are student-led. Student leaders take the initiative to plan meetings, organize events, and conduct activities. Students may participate in Art Club, Crusaders for Life, Fraternity of St. Joseph, Green Team, Honor Council, National Honor Society, Playmakers, Service Committee, Social Committee, Student Government, Videography Club, and Voice.

THE POSITION

It's an exciting time in CTK's short history. Upon completing this search, the school's leadership structure will transition to the ever-popular President-Principal model. CTK's respected and highly successful Principal, Dr. Carl Semmler, is completing his sixth year and will be appointed school President in July 2023.

The Catholic School Principal.serves as the school's spiritual and educational leader and is responsible for exercising independent judgment in implementing a broad array of programs and functions. These responsibilities encompass spiritual development and realizing the school's philosophy, curriculum, co-curricular activities, discipline, and personnel practices. The Principal collaborates with the school President in decisions on the school facilities, marketing, and community relations. In fulfilling this role, the Principal is directly responsible to the School President and the Diocesan Superintendent.

The highest priority for a Catholic school Principal is building a learning community that fully integrates the Catholic faith, adheres to academic excellence, and service to others in accordance with authentic Catholic teaching, in the advancement of the vision of Bishop Peter J. Jugis.

As the chief academic officer of the school, all teaching and learning personnel report to the Principal. The Principal is supported by and leads a robust team of experienced department heads and supports the President with sustaining the academic reputation of the school.





As the primary leader of the school's academic program, the Principal needs to be an experienced educational leader with a deep understanding and appreciation for the challenges high school students—and their parents—are facing today. In addition, candidates will have outstanding communication and interpersonal skills, the prudence to delegate appropriately, and the will to hold the administrative team, faculty, and staff accountable to shared goals and desired outcomes.

- Excellent oral and written communications skills and ability to effectively interact with parents, students, teachers, and administrators. Excellent presentation skills when addressing faculty and staff, parents, and the community in general.
- Decisive executive management skills exemplified by a record of making difficult decisions in an environment with competing demands and limited resources.

- Accessible and approachable leadership style with a reputation for being extremely visible and interactive on campus and at school events, and relating to the students, parents, faculty, and staff with energy, enthusiasm, and warmth.
- Experience in strategic planning, implementation, fiscal management, and oversight are all highly desirable.
