Counselor's Corner

The month of October is Bullying Prevention Month. Mrs. Francis and I went into classrooms to teach lessons on what bullying is, how to stand up to bullying, and how to be a good friend! We wanted to pass along some information to parents as well to explain what bullying is and what you can do if your child experiences, witnesses, or engages in bullying behavior!

What Is Bullying?

Bullying is NOT just conflict. Bullying is:

-Repeated -On Purpose -Meant to cause harm -One-sided There are different types of bullying, such as:

-Physical -Emotional -Cyber -Verbal

<u>Tips for Standing up to</u> <u>Bullying:</u>

If your child is the target of bullying, encourage him/her to:

- -Tell an adult immediately
- -Walk away
- -Stay calm and not bully back
- -Directly tell the other person to stop

If your child witnesses bullying, encourage him/her to:

- -Tell an adult immediately
- -Stay calm
- -Not join in or laugh
- -Help the person who is being bullied

What if my Child is Bullying Others?

Here are some strategies to support your child if you find that he/she is engaging in bullying behaviors:

- -Explicitly tell your child that his/her behavior is not okay
- -Work to find the underlying cause
- -Establish "consequences" that involve the target
- -Continue to monitor the situation

Medicine at School

Prescription (Rx) Medication – Students are encouraged to take Rx medication outside of school hours, whenever possible. If Rx medication must be administered during the school day, a written "Physician's Request for the Administration of Medication by School Personnel" must be completed by the physician and signed by the parent. This form is available in the school office/clinic, as well as on the school's website. All Rx medication must be brought to school by the parent and in the original container.

Over-the-Counter (OTC) Medication – In order for students to receive OTC medications at school, including cough drops, a "Parent Request for the Administration of OTC Medications at School" form must be completed by the student's parent. This form is also available in the school office/clinic, as well as on the school's website. The school stocks some OTC medication, however we encourage parents to provide any medication they wish their student is to be given. All unused medication may be picked up at the end of the school year. These medications must also be in the original container.
