FINANCIAL AID

In 2022-23, Chadwick will award \$6.35 million in need-based financial aid to 21% of our students, supporting tuition and supplemental expenses.

In addition to the school's financial aid program, Chadwick offers a select number of combination need- and merit-based scholarships through generous donations from the MacFarlane Family and Malone Foundation.

Special Programs

OUTDOOR EDUCATION

Chadwick's Outdoor Education Program is one of only nine secondary school programs to be certified by the Association of Experiential Education. The program encourages personal development by placing students in new and challenging outdoor situations. Chadwick students participate in one wilderness course per year, culminating in a three-week senior-year trip, which includes a three-day solo experience.

GLOBAL EDUCATION

Chadwick School offers opportunities for students to travel, study, participate and connect with people and places all around the globe. As a member of Round Square, we have joined more than 200 other schools from 50 countries on five continents that share a commitment to Internationalism, Democracy, Environment, Adventure, Leadership and Service.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Chadwick's Community Service Program represents our commitment to the development of individuals of exemplary character. Although there are no requirements for service at Chadwick, more than 75% of the Upper School chooses to add this weekly commitment as an elective.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Chadwick students are required to complete:

- Three years of history (including global studies and U.S. history)
- Three years of science (two years of which must be a lab science)
- Math through Algebra 2
- Global language through Level 3
- One and a half years of visual and/or performing arts
- Four years of physical education or an athletic team, and Outdoor Education

The program requirements meet or exceed entrance requirements for the University of California system.

HONORS, ADVANCED PLACEMENT AND HIGHEST LEVEL COURSES

Honors Courses

Chadwick School offers honors courses in the following subjects:

Geometry, Algebra 2, Pre-Calculus, Spanish, Chinese, French, and Physics/Chemistry/Biology (PCB) at levels 2 and 3.

Advanced Placement and Highest Level Courses

Students must receive departmental approval to take an Advanced or AP course in mathematics and languages. Other AP courses are open to any student wishing to pursue work at that level. Instructors and faculty advisors work carefully with students in balancing their coursework commitments and in providing counsel about constructing programs. Students wishing to pursue more than three AP or equivalent level courses in one year must submit a petition for permission to do so. It will be reviewed by the advisor, dean of students, instructor(s) and college counselors.

While Advanced Placement is the common top level course in many disciplines, we have also identified the highest level courses that are not available through our AP offerings. These include courses in: Economics, MSON (Malone Schools Online Network) and STEM, including Data Structures and Software Engineering.

Malone Schools Online Network (MSON)

Of the roughly 2,500 private schools in the United States, Chadwick became one of only 38 independent schools to receive a Malone Family Foundation Grant in 2003. Schools are selected for the grants through a rigorous research process, resulting in the addition of an average of three top-level high schools to the Malone network each spring.

Heads of a number of Malone Foundation Schools, including Chadwick, formed a collaborative network under the guidance of Stanford University Online High School to share small classes for our strongest students via telepresence. Through the Malone Schools Online Network, students at Chadwick can take advanced classes at other network schools for credit at their own school. Most of these classes are beyond the AP level. They are designated as MSON on our transcripts.

Reporting Disciplinary Actions

Disciplinary action is defined as probation, suspension or expulsion. If a college or university asks a question regarding disciplinary action, Chadwick will respond to the question, and we strongly recommend that the student respond directly, as well.

Calendar and Schedule

- Modified Block Schedule, including four days with three academic periods (80 minutes each); one day with six academic periods (45 minutes each); two co-curricular periods.
- Semester calendar with an A-F traditional grading system. Minimum passing grade is D-.
- Fall semester ends at the end of December. Spring semester ends in mid-June. Unofficial progress grades may be provided to colleges upon their request.

Grading

- All AP, Post-AP, Advanced and Honors courses, and courses requiring an AP class as a prerequisite are awarded a full extra point (4.0 scale) in determining weighted GPA.
- Chadwick does not report rank or name a valedictorian.
- GPAs are calculated on a weighted 4-point system, based on all Chadwick courses reported on the transcript.
- * Through the COVID-19 pandemic, Chadwick maintained normal grading, even in distance learning periods.

Testing, Accreditation and Affiliations

SAT AND ACT RESULTS

Chadwick School students, like many around the country, were increasingly taking both SAT and ACT tests, ultimately choosing to lean in one direction or the other for second round testing. It becomes more difficult to make “apples to apples” comparisons of average SAT or ACT scores from year to year since fewer reflect the multiple testing results that had been seen in earlier years. Limited availability of the ACT from 2021-2022 resulted in fewer ACT results to report.

Special note for classes of 2021-2023: As with many students across the country during the pandemic, our students’ testing options were severely limited or often canceled unexpectedly. As a result, not all of our students tested.

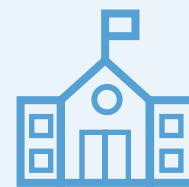


CHADWICK INTERNATIONAL CAMPUSES

Chadwick International is a Pre-K-12 international school, founded in 2010 with an exceptional state-of-the-art facility, and is located in the Songdo International Business District in Incheon, South Korea. The curriculum at Chadwick International is designed to meet the educational standards of the International Baccalaureate (IB) as well as the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

Chadwick Ecopark, near Hanoi, Vietnam, opens in August 2023, and will serve 1,500 students, Pre-K to 12, at full enrollment.

Chadwick International School, Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, opens in August 2025, and will serve 1,200 students Pre-K to 12, at full enrollment.
