



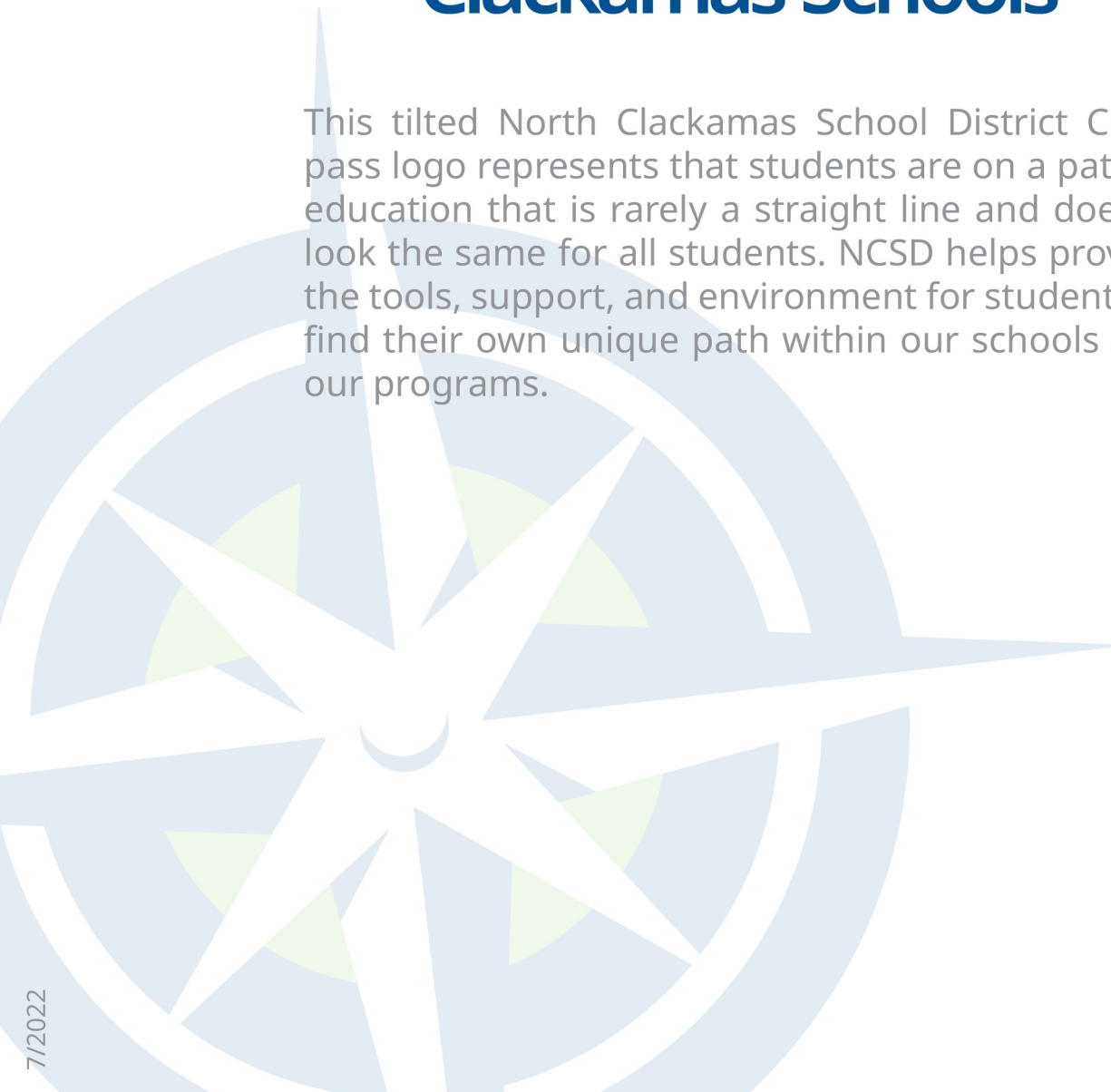

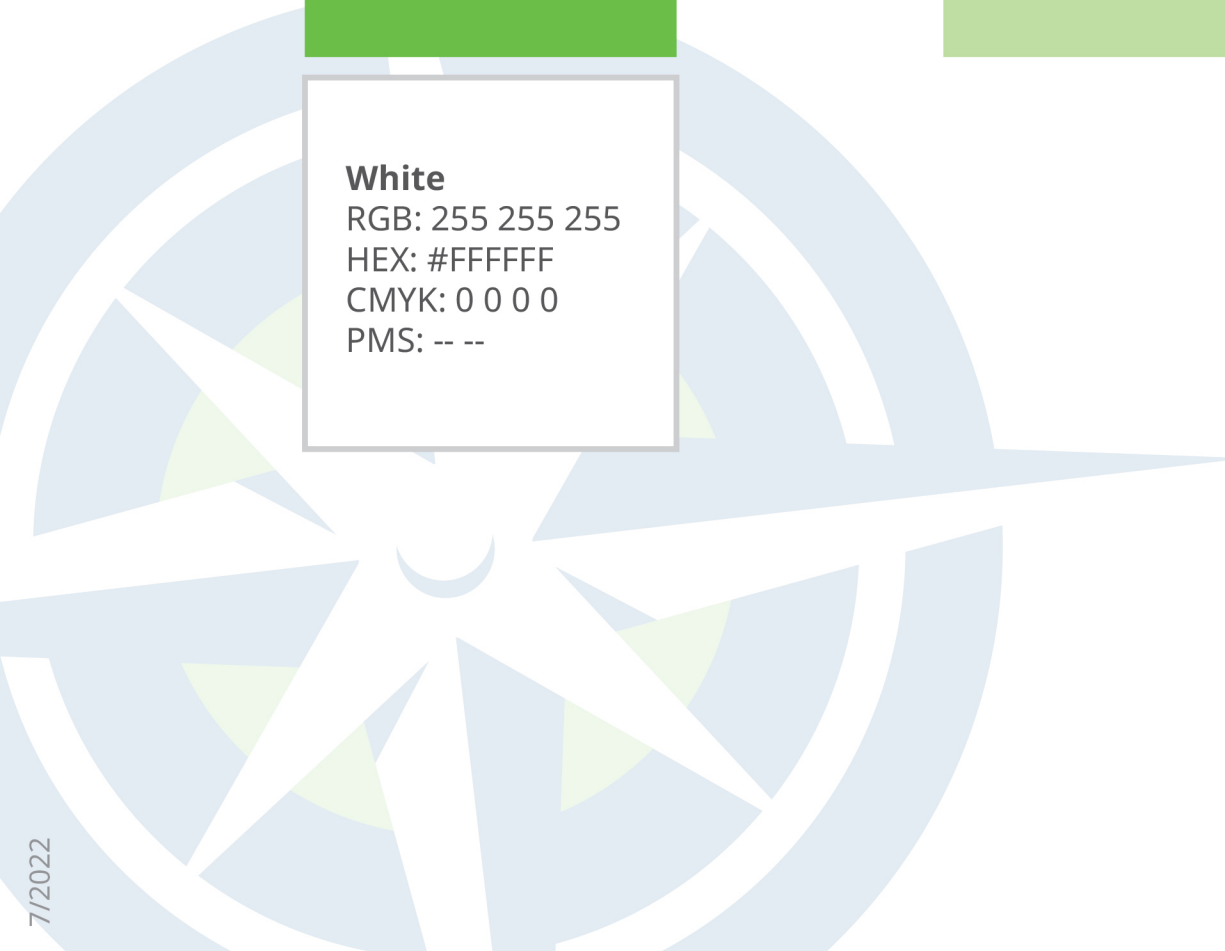

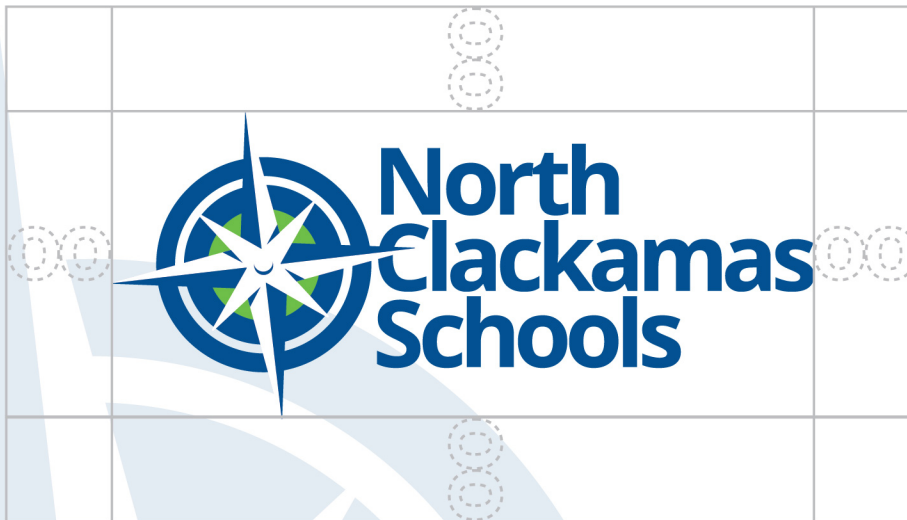

Do not stretch, distort, curve, substitute colors/fonts, or generally alter the logo.

File Types & Uses



Portable Document Format

Format that provides an electronic image of text or text and graphics that looks like a printed document and can be viewed, printed, and electronically transmitted.

Best for sharing full-page documents. Viewable in browsers



Portable Network Graphics

PNGs are amazing for interactive documents such as web pages but are not suitable for print. *Allows for a 'transparent' background contoured around image shape.*

Best for: Website Images, Google Docs, Google Slides



Joint Photographic Experts Group

JPEGs are known for their "lossy" compression, meaning that the quality of the image decreases as the file size decreases. *Requires 'boxed' white or black background.*

Best for: Website Images, Google Docs, Google Slides



Graphics Interchange Format

GIFs are most common in their animated form, due to the limited number of colors, the file size is drastically reduced.

Best for: Animated images, super-low file sizes

Graphic Design Tools Required



Adobe Illustrator | Original File

Vector-based image format most preferred by designers and the most reliable type of file format for using images in all types of projects from web to print, etc.

Best for professionals and creating original artwork



Encapsulated Postscript

A file in vector format that has been designed to produce high-resolution graphics for print. Almost any kind of design software can create an EPS.

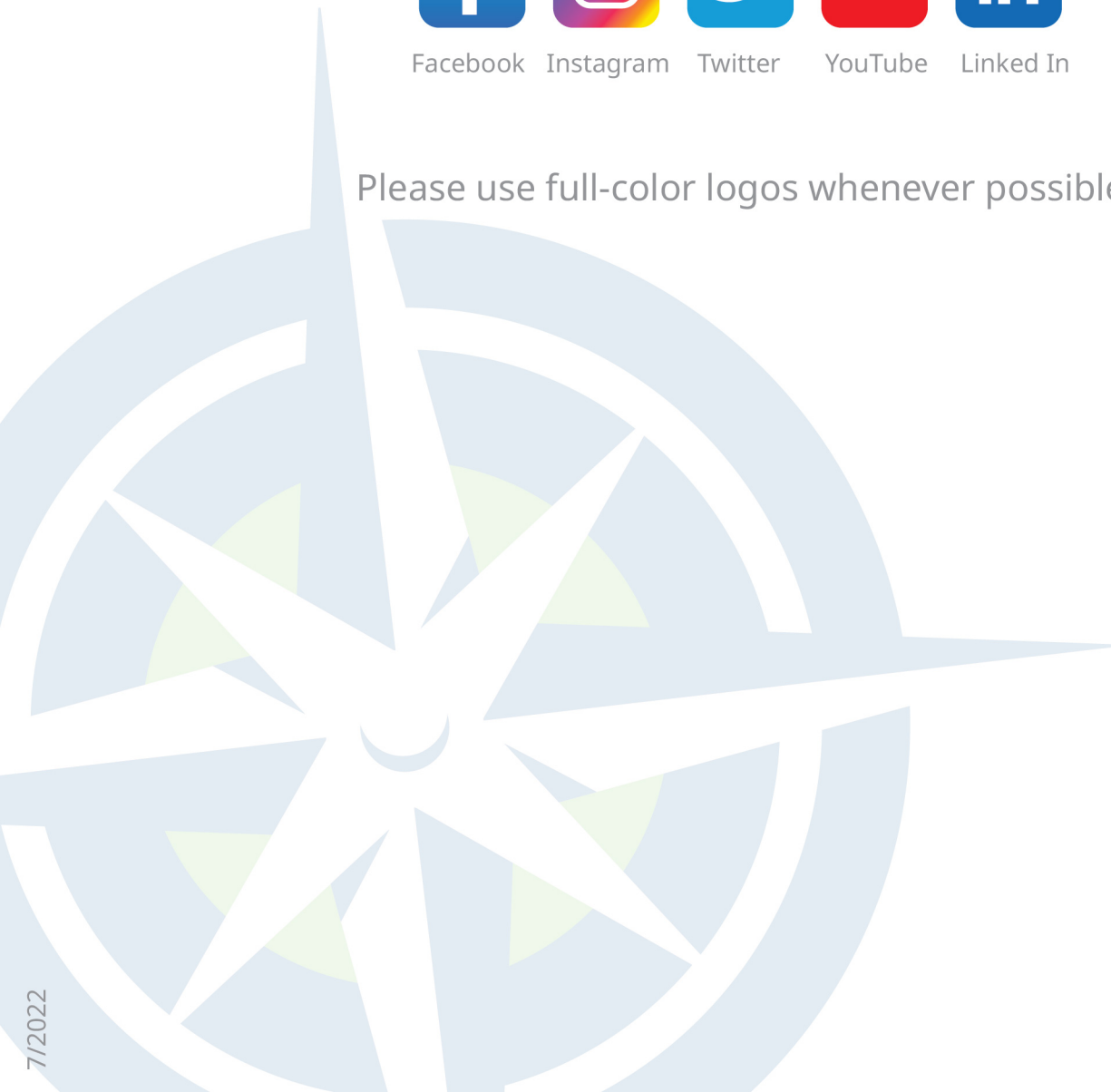
Best for professionals and creating original artwork
