LEAPs:

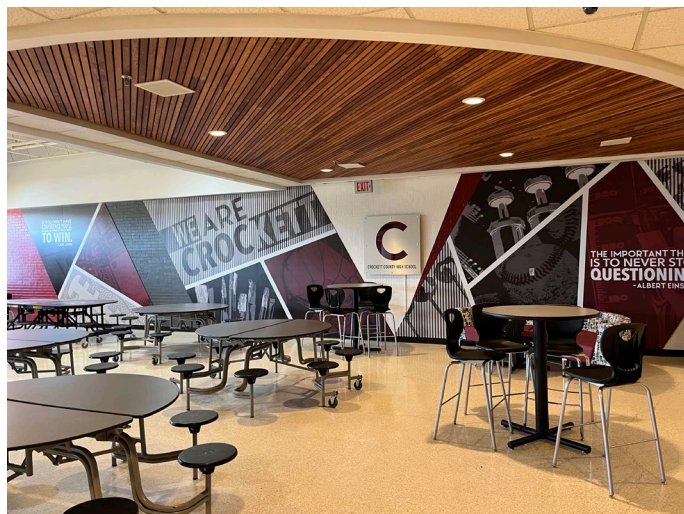
The students in the LEAPs program are enjoying lots of new activities. Students are participating in music, dance exercise, and sign language. Many other activities are planned for the upcoming months.

Coordinated School Health: November is National Diabetes Month. We are so



excited to announce that Crockett County Schools was awarded the Project Diabetes Grant from the TN Dept. of Health. The \$450,000 grant is aimed to help combat diabetes in Crockett County by increasing physical activity! The grant will fund additions to our BlueCross Healthy

Place Park. The additions will include a walking track, multi-purpose field, basketball court, pickleball court, climbing rope tower, and community pavilion. Phase 1 of construction is expected to start this spring! The image below is a draft of the potential layout of the new amenities!

Throughout the 2022-23 school year, the Department of Education will offer several **free additional endorsement programs** in Special Education, Secondary Math, and English as a Second Language through partnerships with Trevecca Nazarene University and the University of Tennessee system. ESSER 2 Update: ESSER 2 was released to districts in the spring of 2021 and will end September 2023. As of October 25, we have \$13,556.30 of remaining funds to be used with ESSER 3 to fund the GES kitchen/cafeteria project.

Over the lifespan of ESSER 2 which was a total of 1,439,623.93, funds were used to purchase the following: one school service van, provide one time teacher bonuses, 55 active panels, Malwarebytes and clearpass, HVACs at FES and MCES gyms, Cellular hotspots, GES playground and outdoor learning space, CCMS roof, CCMS renovation and expansion of kitchen, CCMS cooler/freezer, instructional supplies (Benchmark advance, Iready math, Pearson MyPerspectives, Carnegie math, STEM weather station), summer school personnel, COVID foggers, one school bus, summer school snacks, CCMS tilt skillet, and CCMS LRE walkway.

ESSER 3: We will have funds for ESSER 3 until September 2024.

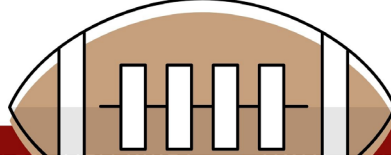
