
Project Based Learning - How We Assess the Fives

Pandemic Haikus

The students decided to use the theme of the pandemic as an inspiration for one of their poems. Students are always encouraged to "write what they know." Given their broad, albeit unfortunate, experience with Covid-19 over the last year, it was not difficult for them to craft some very poignant verses. Let's hope it's the last pandemic poem they every write!



Passionately Pursuing Personal Projects

During a typical morning Bell Ringer exercise, Mrs. Herndon's classes responded to this quote from Malcolm X: "Education is the passport to the future; for tomorrow belongs to those who prepare for it today."

After some discussion and agreement that school was beneficial for young children, they explored whether education really was the most important thing for youth between the ages of 10 and 18, and if it really was the best way for them to prepare for their futures. Perhaps only elementary education was enough? As children entered middle school, maybe they *should* be allowed to have greater choice in what they spent their time on each day, rather than more and more homework. The thought emerged that if given the choice of how to spend their time and energy, what would they choose to do?

Enter Passion Projects, a time set aside for 10 days for students to engage in learning more about a topic, or practicing a skill, of their choice. The excitement in the room was palpable as they decided on their projects, and they dove in immediately. One student is practicing drawing the human form more realistically, while another is learning how to play a singing bowl. Two more are improving their flexibility, and still another is trying to replicate a traditional family recipe that his grandmother makes. The topics were incredibly creative and diverse. Once they understood that their teacher was not only giving them time each class period to pursue their interests, but actually encouraging and supporting them with resources, space, and permission, their eyes lit up.

Middle School can, and should, be about finding yourself, and what better way to do that than by pursuing a project you are passionate about?
