

I. CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE

The August 23, 2022 Public Meeting of the Edison Township Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Mr. Douglas Schneider, at 6:00 P.M. at James Monroe Elementary School, 7 Sharp Road, Edison, NJ.

II. ROLL CALL

Mrs. Kluck took the roll, and the following members were present:

Also in attendance were Bernard F. Bragen, Jr., Ed.D., Superintendent, and Mrs. Ann T. Kluck, Assistant Business Administrator/Board Secretary and Mr. David Rubin, Esquire, Board Attorney.

III. OPENING STATEMENT

Mr. Schneider read the following opening statement:

“The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of, and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Edison Township Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Board of Education Administrative Offices. Copies of these notices were sent to the Home News and Tribune and the Star Ledger on January 4th and June 9, 2022.

The Public may participate at regular meetings in accordance with the By-Laws and the applicable State regulations.”

IV. ADJOURN TO PRIVILEGED SESSION

Mrs. Kluck read the following resolution:

PRIVILEGED SESSION

WHEREAS, Section 8 of the Open Public Meetings Act, Chapter 231 PL 1975 permits the exclusion of the public from a meeting in certain circumstances; and

WHEREAS, this public body is of the opinion that such circumstances presently exist.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED: by the Board of Education of the Township of Edison, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey, as follows:

The public shall be excluded from discussion of and action upon the hereinafter-specified subject matters.

The general nature of the subject matter to be discussed is as follows:

- Student Matters
- Litigation Brought by Former Employees and Students
- ETEA Grievances/PERC/Unfair Labor Practices
- Personnel Matters

It is anticipated at this time that the above-stated subject matter shall be made public at such time as the need for non-disclosure no longer exists. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Sara Cursto, resident, also discussed the sex education curriculum and asked that an opt out form be on parent portal and that the lesson plans should be updated and sent to parents.

i. Participation in Coordinated Transportation - ESCNJ

the Educational Services Commission of New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as the ESCNJ, offers coordinated transportation services; and

WHEREAS,

the ESCNJ will organize and schedule routes to achieve the maximum cost effectiveness;

NOW, THEREFORE,

that in consideration of pro-rated contract costs, plus an administration fee of 5% for Middlesex County district Board of Educations, as presented to the Board as calculated by the billing formula adopted by the ESCNJ's Board of Education. Said formula shall be based on a route cost divided by the number of students allocated to each participating district. The total amount to be charged to districts will be adjusted based on actual costs.

I. The ESCNJ will provide the following services:

- a. routes coordinated with other districts to achieve a maximum cost reduction while maintaining a realistic capacity and travel time;
- b. monthly billing and invoices;
- c. computer print-outs of student lists for all routes coordinated by ESCNJ;

- d. all necessary interaction and communication between the sending district, and the respective transportation contractors;
- e. constant review and revision of routes;
- f. provide transportation within five days or sooner after receipt of the written request; and

IT IS FURTHER
AGREED:

that the Board will provide the ESCNJ with the following:

- a. requests for special transportation on approved forms to be provided by the ESCNJ, completed in full and signed by authorized district personnel;
- b. withdrawal for any transportation must be provided in writing and signed by authorized district personnel; no billing adjustments will be made without this completed form and will become effective on the date the form is received;

II. Additional Cost – all additional costs generated by unique requests such as mid-day runs or early dismissals will be borne by the district. All such costs must first be approved by the Board.

III. Length of Agreement – this agreement and obligations and requirements therein shall be in effect between July 1, 2022 and June 30, 2023.

IV. Entire Agreement – this agreement constitutes the entire and only agreement between the parties and may be amended by an instrument in writing over authorized signature.

1. BUDGET PLANNING AND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE

August 15, 2022 – 4:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M.

Recommendations:

- The Committee advised DCO and DMR that further review is required by the Committee before making any decisions on the ESIP Proposals specifically solar implementation proposal and asked the administration not to put anything related to this on the August Agenda.
- The Committee advised the administration to move forward to absorb the balance issue with MySchoolbucks.
- The Committee will regroup at some point after the August board meeting.
- ESIP – DCO had put out the Solar Competitive Contract Bid as a part of their ESIP. They had received six (6) bids and brought in two vendors to present to the Committee: Advanced Solar and Sunlight General Capital. DCO recommended Advanced Solar for the work. Financial criteria and other aspects were presented and discussed along with company portfolio, etc. Due to a change in the rules, ITC is now at 30% given by Federal Government. The Committee asked several questions and they understood and acknowledged that the rates may change in positive direction based on the most recent ITC. The Committee needs a detailed further review of the aspects and implementation plan and will explore options along with the administration. DCO Energy had asked to include that in the August meeting agenda, which the committee recommended the administration not to do so, citing needs for proper research for accountability to taxpayers and having it done the right way with the right vendors at the right time.

ECM Metrics were discussed, such as LED Tube, lighting controls, boiler replacement, etc. The Committee decided to carefully review the measures recommended so that the best options can be chosen for the District before the Committee moves forward and asked the administration not to move forward with the recommended dates for the August meeting.

The Committee will regroup for discussing this further so that appropriate decisions can be made.

- JP Stevens HS Baseball Field – DMR Architects gave their recommendation about the baseball field. The Committee decided to move forward with the project.
- Technology Updates – Mr. Barca provided an update on the technology projects. New devices have been ordered for Grades 1, 6 and 8, new chromebooks. They are all in cases now received. iPads are ready for incoming Kindergarten students. All high school MacBooks are on target and updated. All children should have a device ready per the administration. Devices for the staff – an update was discussed. New line boards – implementation for high school and middle school is completed and equipment for Lincoln School addition and update for Eidson High school auditorium and building and classroom readiness.
- RFP – The Committee asked the Administration to put out a bid in August for MAS Masonry and roofing repair company. The Committee asked again to bid for that.
- Ongoing Capital Projects – Mr. Kolibas provided an update on ongoing projects at all schools. There were some changes and an additional playground is needed for an elementary school. The Committee asked Mr. Kolibas to move forward with it. Mrs. Kluck provided an update on MySchoolbucks balance to which the Committee asked to move forward with the amount.

2. CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

- Elementary – New Curriculum
 - Spanish (K) – For Full Day Adjustment
- Elementary – updated Curriculum – Adjusted based on Teacher Feedback & Data
 - ELA – Updated to reflect standards alignment in pacing, created a resource guide with strategies, prompts and what, how and why of instruction. Also embedded questions that match NJSLA language.
 - SS – Revised to match new SS standards, including diverse texts to match the topics.
 - Kindergarten – Full day schedule adjustments. Added to Science, SS, ELA and Math.

- Math – Including challenge lessons, remedial lessons, problem solving framework, detailed models of strategies for teaching and for solving. Rubrics added, and NJSLA style questions.
 - Science – Based on feedback, scope and sequence was adjusted, added more labs, and strategies to make the reading portion more interactive.
 - Social Emotional – Based on observations post pandemic, adding lessons including role playing, read alouds, videos, discussion, stems, scenarios for the first ten days of school focusing on behavior and self-regulation.
 - G&T - Added to push in class lessons and developed new interactive units.
 - Special Education
 - Updated CST Structure – K-8 that came from feedback from parent community and administrative observations. CST members will work with and provide input to their students from the start of kindergarten to 8th grade (follow their students).

3. POLICY COMMITTEE

August 9, 2022 – 4:30 P.M. – 6:35 P.M.

In attendance: Shivi Madhukar, Kevin Hadjuk, Ed.D., Bernard F. Bragen, Jr., Ed.D., Edward Aldarelli, Ed.D.

- There were numerous updates at this meeting. Four extensive policy alerts, sent by Strauss Esmay Associates, were reviewed. The first was Policy Alert 225 sent October 2021. The following policies will be on the September agenda for the first of two readings by the full board and public:
 - School Employee Vaccination Requirements – This is a new board policy that includes mandated additions.
 - Safety Plan for Healthcare Settings in School Buildings – This is a new board policy that includes mandated additions.
 - Emergency Virtual or Remote Instruction program – This is a new board policy that included mandated addition.
 - Sexual Harassment of Students – Revisions made to this board Policy and Regulations 5751. (These revisions were relevant to the alignment of New Jersey’s HIB Bill of Rights and the Title IX Regulations on Sexual Harassment and to describe the Federal Office of Civil Rights (OCR) interpretation of the District’s responsibility under Title IX related to sexual harassment). The changes within this policy were mandated.
- The second was Policy Alert 226. This was sent January 2022. The following policies will be on the September agenda for the first of two readings by the full board and public.
 - Student Surveys, Analysis, Evaluations, Examinations, Testing, or Treatment. There are mandated changes to this policy that address the issue of a school district administering a

survey, analysis, evaluation, examination, testing, or treatment funded in whole or in part by a program of the United States Department of Education.

- Prevention and Treatment of Sports-Related Concussions and Head Injuries. This policy was revised to include mandated language and to include “intramural sports” along with “interscholastic sports” and “cheerleading programs”.
- Additional/Compensatory Special Education and Related Services. This new policy includes mandated updates in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The new statute applies to students with disabilities who exceed, or will exceed, the current age of eligibility, which is 21 years old in 2020-2021, 2021-2022 or the 2022-2023 school years. It requires the Board of Education to offer up to one year of additional or compensatory special education and related services through the student’s IEP.
- Student Assessment. This policy was revised to include the mandated implementation of an approved English language proficiency assessment for English language learners with an IEP to measure a student’s progress in English language proficiency. Dr. Bragen is required to report only the final results of the annual assessment to the Board and to the members of the public.
- Political Activities – This policy includes the revision of the term “board of chosen freeholders” to “board of county commissioners”. Also, the terms “freehold” and “chosen freehold” shall be “county commissioner” within the policy.
- High School Graduation – The revisions to this policy were mandated to provide greater clarity regarding the graduation assessment requirements for the classes of 2023, 2024, 2025 and updates to the high school diploma criteria for out-of-school individuals. Dr. Bragen suggested using the program of studies in our schools compared to the state requirements for graduation.
- Anti-hazing – The “Timothy J. Piazza’s Law” was passed and approved on August 24, 2021 and went into effect on March 1, 2022. The law requires our Middle Schools and High Schools to adopt an anti-hazing policy. This new policy is mandated and requires a separate investigation to occur outside of a possible HIB investigation. It should be noted that the Department of Education has not documented the actual procedures yet to comply with this policy.
- Bias Crimes and Bias-Related Acts – This mandated policy and regulation has been revised and updated to be aligned with the Memorandum of Agreement between our Edison School District and Law Enforcement Officials (MOA). Gender identity or expression and national origin has been added to the protected class of individuals. Additionally, “school property” has been revised to “school grounds”. Also, the reporting provisions have been expanded to indicate when an incident should have “prompt” as compared to “immediate” reporting to law enforcement. All bias related incidents must be reported to local law enforcement and the county prosecutor.
- Administration of School Surveys. This policy was revised to include the new mandated statute that allows school districts to administer surveys; assessment; analysis; or evaluations concerning student health, only if prior written notification has been provided to parents.
- The third was Policy Alert 227. This alert was sent April 2022. The following policies will be on the September agenda for the first of two readings by the full board and public.
 - Recordkeeping for Healthcare settings in Schools – This new mandated policy now abolishes Policy 1648.14 but keeps the reporting and record keeping requirements of the policy that the Department of Health is still requiring.
 - Title I School and District Policy – Dr. Bragen explained that all schools in Edison receive Title I funding. It is a Federal Mandate to have a policy in place for each school.

- Student Intervention and Referral Services – This mandated policy was revised to include the requirement that a school district “choose an appropriate multidisciplinary team approach, such as RTI or Multi-tiered System of Support (MTSS) model, for planning and delivering services to children under the administrative code. Also, there are changes to who can participate in the I & RS team.
- HIB – Policy 5512 – This policy was revised to align with the mandated updates to the law provided in P.L. 2021 signed in January 2022. The new provisions of the revised law began July 1, 2022. There were substantial mandated changes and are included in the agenda. Dr. Bragen discussed that the expectation of the district is that every allegation of HIB is investigated.
- Maintenance and Repair – The regulation and policy have been revised to include the mandated verbiage that all districts must employ a certified educational facilities manager. William Kolibas is our Director of Facilities in relation to this revision.
- Emergency and Crisis Situations – This policy was updated to include new mandated language from Section 18A regarding school security drills. This new law requires a school district to ensure a school security drill that occurs when students are present is only conducted after advance written notice has been provided to the parents and staff. This revision is being reviewed for accuracy by Dr. Bragen due to the impacts this could have on school safety.
- Cooperation with Law Enforcement – This policy and regulation have been rewritten to align with the procedures of law enforcement operations in schools. The revisions are mandated to require school districts to meet annually to review, revise, and adopt the “Uniform State Memorandum of Agreement Between Education and Law Enforcement.”
- The fourth was Policy Alert 228. This alert was sent January 2022. The following policies will be on the September agenda for the first of two readings by the full board and public.
 - High School Student Representative to the Board of Education – this mandated change to the policy requires only one student representative to serve, as a non-voting member, on the Board of Education. The Board has chosen to have two representatives, one student from John P. Stevens High School and one student from Edison High School.
 - Website Accessibility – Mandated changes to the policy were needed to align with the Office of Civil Rights and recent settlement agreements with several New Jersey School Districts relating to compliance with Content Accessibility Guidelines on the school district website.
 - Every Student Succeeds Act – Mandated revisions were made to update Title I engagement expectations. Terms were changes from ‘parental involvement’ to parent and family engagement.”
 - Care of School Property – the policy was revised to update mandated language and include an updated legal citation which addresses the school district’s right to reimbursement for damaged, lost, or destroyed textbooks loaned to a student. Also revisions were made on the steps used to assess and collect textbook fines.
 - School District issued Student ID Cards – This policy requires the Board of Education to print on the back of the student ID cards the telephone number for the New Jersey Suicide Prevention Hotline (NJ Hopeline) and the contact information for a crisis text line. This is for grades 7-12 only in our district.
 - Student Journalism – This mandated new policy is in response to a new statute that requires school districts to adopt a policy that allows student freedom of expression in accordance with the provisions of the new statutes. This policy includes a process school officials must follow when it is believed the student expression in a school-sponsored media is not protected.

XI. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION

Mrs. Madhukar questioned the Subscription Busing Form for payment.

Mrs. White was glad that everything is on track and operating well, per Mr. Barca. She questioned school property and acquiring Stelton School

Mr. Shi spoke about the property in Metuchen where the government came in for a new turf field owned by the Township. Edison Township owns the Edison High School Junior Varsity field and needs to update it. He also discussed GPS tracking on school buses and sharing the App with parents and questioned the status of residency verification.

Mr. Rivera congratulated Mr. Jon Toth as the new Business Administrator and wished everyone a good new school year.

Mr. B. Patel wished everyone good luck with the new school year. He stated that Stelton School or any property the Township wants to give the Board of Education will be gladly accepted. He also discussed an infrastructure plan and that the Board needs to ensure everyone that they will not overspend. Mr. Patel mentioned that the summer meal plan went smoothly, enrollment seemed to be going smoothly and full-day Kindergarten is a good thing.

Mr. M. Patel mentioned that Stelton School property was originally part of the Board of Education. He feels student mental well-being is important.

Dr. Hajduk discussed enrollment issues, he wished the staff and students good luck this year and welcomed the new Business Administrator, Jon Toth.

Mr. Schneider stated that it was a unanimous vote for the new BA, Mr. Toth. He thanked Dr. Aldarelli and the team for onboarding the new staff members and was glad to see no lines for enrollment and transportation,

Mr. Shi thanked Dr. Bragen and Mrs. Kluck for helping to fulfill the role of the Business Administrator.

XII. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Jon Toth, newly hired Business Administrator, stated that he looks forward to working with Edison.

Life Scout Koshi, from John P. Stevens High School, stated she was the first female of color to become an Eagle Scout. She asked for volunteers and printed an informational flyer to distribute and spread the word about initiative.

Chiavalli Patel, resident, thanked Mrs. Madhukar regarding transportation from Amboy Avenue; requesting to review routes and move the stop from Amboy Avenue and also asked that a list of buses with GPS tracking be sent out to parents.

Elaine Kauffman, resident, discussed a keepsake coloring booklet she prepared and discussed a 8 week course for PTAs.

Susan Campione, resident, discussed the ETEA Scholarship.

Manish Patel, resident, discussed the Inman Avenue bus stops, stated that bus passes are not sent out in a timely manner, along with bus routes and discussed other busing issues. He asked when Biology will come back to the schools.

A resident asked why instruction time had to be cut in half for 7th graders and did not like seeing elective education going down.

Sara Cursto, resident, stated that surveys are sold to third parties and asked if parents will get consent forms.

Joyce Ship-Freeman, resident, questioned the sex ed curriculum. She also questioned the Sharks football team's fees.

Nick Fagen, resident, had transportation concerns. He questioned the capital improvement plan and safety and security measures and spoke about the new housing complex residency where Charlie Brown Restaurant used to be.

Elizabeth Conway, resident, stated that the Charlie Brown complex is being addressed with the town council. She discussed the high school representatives on the Board of Education, the Lincoln School update, Kindergarten numbers, and said that directors and supervisors are present at this meeting to answer any questions the public may have. Mrs. Conway also asked if there are enough teachers and security in the schools.

Maria Orchid, resident, asked for cleanup volunteers. She asked everyone to drive safely now that schools open on September 6th and thanked everyone for coming to the Community Gardens and announced a free concert in the park on September 5th.

Charles Ross, Edison High School Principal, announced the September 2nd football game against Edison High School and John P. Stevens High School and the next game against Ocean City High School. He also informed everyone about the band show on September 10th and gave a 'month at a glance' for Edison High School activities.

Matt Hrevnak, ETEA Vice President, welcomed Jon Toth, discussed the new teacher orientation and stated he was proud of the Edison teachers. He also discussed the sex ed curriculum.

Chiavalli Patel, resident, questioned what would be done if buses were late picking up the students.

A resident questioned class sizes and enrollment.

Joyce Ship-Freeman, resident, stated that she was tired of the “race game” and how cricket is more important than education.

Nick Fagen, resident, discussed a Zoning Board case that took 95 days for an appeal due November 1st.

Manish Patel asked the Board to answer the questions and not to insult him.
