## Our Goals for Student Achievement

#### District Goals

Our District Improvement Plan outlines goals and measurable objectives for the entire district. Those measurable objectives for student achievement are:

- ♣ Increase the number of students reading at or above grade level as indicated by their Lexile level.
- ♣ Increase the percentage of students scoring proficient or higher on the Georgia Milestones.
- ♣ Increase the graduation rate of the 4-Year Cohort annually.
- ♣ Increase parent participation at school events.
- ♣ Decrease the number of student absences each year.
- ♣ Decrease the percentage of student discipline referrals in each school each year.

### Wilcox Middle School

WCHS administrators and teachers have studied our student performance data to decide on the most important areas of improvement for our school during this school year.

Therefore, for school year 2022-2023:

- 1) Student performance on Georgia Milestones Assessment (GMAS) Levels 2, 3, and 4 will improve by at least 3% over the previous year's performance
- 2) The promotion rate from one grade to the next will be at least 90% and
- 3) Parental participation in events that support school success will increase by at least 5%.
