Planning for the Transition from Early Intervention to the Committee on Preschool Special Education for Families (2-Part Workshop)

Information will be provided regarding the continuum of services at the preschool level and how specially designed instruction and supplementary services can be provided within the settings across the continuum (i.e., related services, itinerant teacher, special class integrated setting, and special classes, etc.).

Specially Designed Instruction: A Guide for Families and Caregivers

This workshop is intended as a guide about Specially Designed Instruction (SDI) for families and caregivers of students with disabilities. SDI is the adaptation of content, methodology, and/or delivery of instruction based on the needs of an individual student to ensure access to general education curriculum. This type of instruction is required for students with disabilities and is individualized based on the impact of the student's disability.
