## Write a Letter to Ms. Bridges

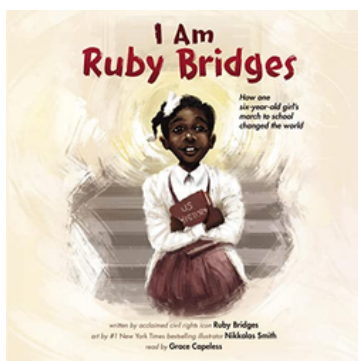
