At times being a virtual academy student can be tough due to technology glitches that accidentally erase our work or at times causes us to enter late to class. Thankfully these and many other issues can be resolved with some tech tips.



Add your commonly used websites to your favorites bar

- 1. The first step to add a website to your favorites bar is to open a tab by clicking on the Microsoft edge button which is at the bottom left corner of your screen
- 2. when you open the tab you can start to type in your commonly used website on either one of the search bars at the top of the tab.
- 3. After you reach the website you should see a star with a plus sign on top of the star at the top right corner of the screen. Once you spot the icon press it.
- 4. When you press the icon, a menu should appear which should show the name, folder, and more options, but for now, you can adjust the name of their website and click done.

Finally, you can access the favorites bar by opening a tab and tapping the name of the website.

Control keys to copy, cut & paste

Latte's Cafe

Jump into the world of culinary fantasy where Camila Rojas recreates recipes from books, tv, movies, and more

For this spooky season, there's nothing more magical than going on a Harry Potter marathon. A common fruit used throughout the HarryPotter series are pumpkins, which Hagrid grows in his garden (in loving memory of the late Robbie Coltrane) and when Harry breaks his arm he's given pumpkin juice which is supposed to taste terrible. Instead of making horrible pumpkin juice, I recreated a popular treat that is given on the train to Hogwarts by the HoneyDukes Express, Pumpkin Pasties. Pumpkin Pasties are similar to Cornish pasties, which have a savory taste. Pumpkin pasties have a creamy sweet filling a crunchy outer shell.

Time: 1 hour 30 minutes Difficulty: 1/5

Ingredients:

Pastry Crusts:

- 1 ¼ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 tablespoon granulated sugar
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 5 tablespoons cold unsalted butter, cut into pieces
- 3 tablespoons vegetable shortening
- 6 tablespoons ice water

Filling:

- 1 cup canned pumpkin puree
- ¼ cup granulated sugar
- 1 egg
- 14 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg (or ground nutmeg)
- ¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ¼ teaspoon ground ginger
- 2 tablespoons sweetened condensed milk (optional)
- 2 pinches of salt
- % teaspoon 5 Chinese spice powder.



Steps:

1. Place the flour, sugar, and salt in the bowl of a food processor (if not use a blender)Pulse a few times to combine. Add the butter and shortening and pulse about 12 times until the mixture resembles a coarse yellow meal, with no white powder bits remaining.

2. Transfer the mixture to a flat surface. Sprinkle 4 tablespoons of cold water over the mixture and begin to knead until it all clumps together. If it's too dry add more water 1 tablespoon at a time (it is better too wet than too dry). Gather the dough into a ball and then pat it into a disk. Wrap it in plastic wrap and refrigerate it for at least 1 hour.

3. Combine the Pumpkin, sugar, egg, nutmeg, cinnamon, ginger, sweetened condensed milk, salt, and 5 Chinese spice powder in a bowl and mix together well.

4. Preheat the oven to 400 F. Roll out the dough ½-inch thick. Use a Saucer to cut out 6-inch circles.

5. Put 2 to 3 tablespoons of filling in the center of each circle of dough. Moisten the edges with water, fold the dough over the filling, and crimp with a fork to seal the edges. Cut skits to make vents.

6. Bake on an ungreased cookie sheet for 30 minutes or until golden brown
