Should Seniors Still Take the ACT?

The answer is....it depends on the scholarship deadlines of a student's school of interest. For example, if a student is planning to apply to BYU, taking the December ACT would not help, as the score would not arrive before their deadline. However, if a senior wants to apply to other schools with a later scholarship deadline, they could boost their score and qualify for a better scholarship. Missions, Military and Humanitarian Service

College Bound students planning to serve should do the following.

1. Apply to all universities of possible interest.
2. Accept all scholarship offers and admissions.
3. Complete the deferral process for each university

Students that follow these steps will have scholarship offers and admissions waiting for them when they return. Students that do not complete all of the above will start over when they return, including retaking the ACT.

A student receiving a Concurrent Enrollment Edge scholarship will receive a \$2,000 tuition waiver per year for four years (up to \$1,000 per semester for eight semesters) **representing a total value of \$8,000.**

Complete a total of 12 credit hours (or more) of any combination of concurrent enrollment courses offered at Viewmont.

Earn a minimum 3.0 (B) cumulative grade point average on all concurrent enrollment course work.
