



IS IT A SCAM OR THE IRS? – You know the drill. Someone calls claiming to be from the IRS and demands that you pay back taxes owed to the agency immediately or law enforcement will come knocking. The caller turns out to be a scammer and identity thief, but how can you really know? The IRS says it first contacts taxpayers by letter, and if the agency does call, the time and date will have been arranged in advance, usually with a mailed notice to confirm the appointment. If you get such a notice, you can always check that the letter is legit by logging on to your online IRS account or calling the agency.

The agency says on its website: IRS agents may make "unannounced visits to a taxpayer's home or place of business to discuss taxes owed, delinquent tax returns or a business falling behind on payroll tax deposits." But you should always ask to see ID. IRS agents carry two forms of official identification, a pocket commission and HSPD-12 card, a standard form of ID for federal employees. Both types of ID have serial numbers and photos of the employee.

What the IRS won't do is-

- send text messages;
- reach out through social media; or
- initiate contact by e-mail.

Legitimate efforts to resolve a tax issue (whether from a phone call, in person visit or letter) also won't be carried out with threats or demands that you pay in an unusual way. If you're still suspicious and don't want to write a check, you can pay the IRS directly online through the electronic federal tax payment system at eftps.gov. (*Kiplinger's Retirement Report*)
