Grade 6 -

We are excited to enter break on a strong note. We are finishing up the first math unit, submitting our first essay in LA Lab, hitting the halfway mark in "Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief" in LA, debating and learning about deforestation in Social Studies and learning about water on our planet in Science. Grade 8 -

Mr. Lew's Engineering & Technology class has been VERY busy the past few weeks:

As part of Mr. Lew's 8th grade STEM class, students studied the anatomy of the brain and learned how the different parts of the brain can be affected by traumatic brain injuries (TBIs) and concussions. Students then took their knowledge of TBIs and looked at the advancement of football helmets over time as they attempted to prevent concussions. Lastly, students used the "engineering design process" from class to design and develop their own football helmets for an egg. As part of the final test, students dropped the eggs to see if their helmets worked. Lastly, the finalists got to launch their eggs great distances with their egg helmets on to test their effectiveness.

- 1st place went to Sebastian Garcia with 10 successful launches at the height of approx 60 ft and 50 vards.
- · 2nd place went to Max Fronteras with 8 successful launches at similar distances.

Congratulations to all of Mr. Lew's 8th-grade STEM students who used their knowledge of the brain to design better football helmets that will help prevent concussions.

The Bridge Challenge was a success!

All of Mr. Lew's 8th-grade STEM students did a fantastic job engineering their bridges while considering the forces of; load, tension, and compression. However, 3 students really spanned the gap (pun intended:)

- 1st place went to Gabe Martinez and Hudson Braun with their bridge holding an unbelievable 105 lbs!
- 2nd place went to Cameron Mathers with his bridge holding: 99.5 lbs!
- 3rd place went to: Brooke Anderson & Zophia (Sophie) Topor with 89 lbs!
