What is the 98c Learning Loss Funding?

- Public Act 144 of 2022- Section 98c was signed into law on July 14, 2022, by Governor Whitmer.
- Section 98c appropriates funding to address learning loss as part of the Governor's Emergency Education Relief (GEER) Fund and part of the Esser II fund.

What are the eligibility requirements of 98c?

- Local Education Agencies (LEA's) must present a learning loss plan to Boards of Education by October 30, 2022.
- The presentation must explain how funding received will be used to address learning loss.
- A link to the plan must be posted on the LEA's website and an assurance must be given to post regular updates.
- A description of district metrics used to determine the impact of the district's funded initiatives must also be included.

Elementary Learning Loss Plan

- Tutoring is one of the most effective means of lifting student achievement.
- Research has shown that well-designed tutoring programs can be very effective in improving children's academic growth.
- Structured tutoring models with high quality implementation allow tutors to personalize learning experiences tailored to specific student needs.
- The effects of tutoring programs tend to be the strongest among earlier grades.



In partnership with the Macomb Intermediate School District, Clintondale Community Schools is offering tutoring sessions in reading or math to a select group of students who would benefit from additional small group support. The goal of the tutoring program is to maximize academic potential, build motivation, and ensure the academic success of 1st-2nd grade students.

6-8 Intervention Plan using **Map Accelerator**

- Clintondale Middle School is looking at Map Accelerator for 6-8th grade students.
- [Here](#) is a short video on the power of Map Accelerator.
- In a nutshell, it's a differentiation tool that automatically creates an individualized learning pathway for any student at a 229 or below (based on their [NWEA subscores](#)).
- It's a mastery based system that requires mixed spiral practice.
- Includes a robust teacher dashboard that show mastery of skills, standards still needed, and time on task.
- Students in a study in 2021-2022 showed growth of learning two skills a week when using Map Accelerator for 30-45 minutes per week.
