Spartans Sign Division-1 National Letters of Intent

On Wednesday, November 9, three Sayre School seniors will sign Division-I National Letters of Intent on the first day of the NCAA Early Signing Period.

Kylee Dennis will sign to play women's basketball at the University of Southern Indiana, a member of the Ohio Valley Conference. Raymond Saatman will sign to play baseball in the Southeastern Conference at the University of Kentucky, while Addie Stockham will sign to play baseball with Eastern Kentucky University, of the Atlantic Sun Conference.

Dennis has averaged 19 points per game over the course of her high school career, amassing a total of 1,450 points. Her slashing style of play has resulted in her converting a total of 301 free throws.

Saatman and Stockham have led Sayre to consecutive 42nd district baseball championships, and to a runner-up finish in last spring's 11th region tournament. Saatman, a right-handed pitcher, was 8-1 in his junior year with an earned-run average of 1.43. He struck out 93 batters in 63 innings pitched. He also had a .348 batting average, and knocked in 20 runs.

Stockham, a left-handed pitcher, was 5-2 last season on the mound, with an earned-run average of 2.20. He struck out 42 batters in 54 innings. He boasted a .390 batting average, along with 30 RBI's. Both Saatman and Stockham have earned multiple All-District and All-Region team honors.

Dennis, Saatman, and Stockham will sign during a ceremony hosted in the Sayre Upper School on **Wednesday, November 9, at 3:00 pm**. The Upper School is located at 240 N. Limestone Street, Lexington.
