


# Student and Parent Presentation



## Purpose



To provide academically talented high school juniors and seniors with an opportunity to acquire university course credit and introduce them to the "Total University Experience" while still attending high school.



## DC Admissions Criteria



Students seeking Dual Credit opportunities with UTRGV will have an individual academic profile created based on a variety of factors, including but not limited to:

- · High School Class Rank;
- · GPA;
- College Entrance Exams (SAT/ACT) (PSAT/ACT-PLAN);
- Extracurricular Activities;
- · Community Involvement;

Academic profiles are created with submitted documentation and admission decisions are made based on that profile and accomplishments to date.

#### DC Admissions Criteria



Students must be classified as a Junior or Senior in High School and graduating under the Foundation w/Endorsement or Distinguished Plan

Dual Credit Students typically meet one or more of the following criteria:

- · Ranked in the Top 20% of their class;
- Have a 85 GPA or higher; STISD 90 GPA
- Achieve an ACT Composite of 20 or higher;
- Achieve an SAT Total of 1110 (EBRW & MATH combined) or higher;
- Achieve a PSAT Section Score of 460 (EBRW) and 510 (MATH) or higher;
- · Achieve a PLAN Composite of 23 or higher

# Program Policies and Procedures UTRO



Students are not allowed to take any developmental/remedial courses

Students are not allowed to take any kinesiology (physical education) or health courses Students can enroll in a maximum of 12 credit hours, with the recommendation of the student's counselor and administrators

For Spring 2023, students can only take courses that are part of the Core Curriculum (ex. No 3000/4000 level courses)

All pre-requisites, if any, must be met before enrolling for a course.

Must earn grades of "C" or better in order to continue in the DC program Students must meet all university deadlines regarding course drops/withdrawals/etc.

## Student Advisement



New student advisement is vital to helping you succeed in college courses

Required of all New Dual Credit students

New students can sign up once accepted, TSI scores & vaccine are submitted, and account is activated

Ensures registration in appropriate classes based on TSI scores and course pre-requisites

Program policies and restrictions will be discussed

Advisement is **mandatory** prior to registration

## Student Responsibilities



Students are expected to read, save, and consult the course syllabus. The syllabus spells out what is expected of students, when assignments are due, and how grades are determined.

Initiate contact with professors if you need assistance or clarification.

Actively participate in class through discussion boards and assignments and take notes to identify the important points. Good notes are a must.

The academic year is divided into two separate 15-week semesters, plus a week after each semester for exams. Summer sessions are typically 5-weeks long and accelerated in their pacing.

## College Courses VS. High School Courses



#### **High School Courses**

Courses are typically smaller

Most of the course learning and assignments are completed in class.

Study time outside of class may vary



#### **College Courses**

Courses are typically larger

Most of the course learning and assignments are completed outside of class.
