

PE classes took to the great outdoors for a week of perfect weather, Hudson hiking, and Sandy Beach-side lunch.












## Mugwort, Dogbane, and More

### **Parent Night Preps for Junior Year**

9th and 10th Grade Parent Night answers the question:

"What should I know before my child becomes a Junior?"



Haldane High School hosted its annual 9/10 Parent Night on October 27 with a detailed look at the important decisions made during a student's junior year. The high school guidance department and department chairs provided an overview of the academic programs, followed by a representative from Summit Educational Group who guided families through the standardized testing process. The presentation highlighted the differences between SATs and ACTs, appropriate test prep, and how to determine which assessment might be better for each student.
