Dear RMS-CES families,

First and foremost, I want to express gratitude for all you have done to support your child's learning during the first quarter. This quarter has shown students adjusting to a school year, building connections with peers and teachers and growing as a person and a learner. In addition, this quarter has provided students with the opportunity to go on at least one environmentally focused outdoor field trip.

I would encourage all parents to take advantage of the transition between first and second quarter to help coach and guide your child to reflect on the strengths and weaknesses of the first quarter and help them set goals for themselves for what the next quarter looks like. We know that accomplishing any goal first starts with seeing the result you want in your mind, and being able to strategically plan ways to accomplish your goal. Although adolescents might not readily admit it, goal setting and motivation are things that they might not fully understand how to do. I would encourage you to ask your child" what is your goal for quarter two? ", And see what they share with you. We appreciate the partnership in working together to support students, creating and accomplishing their goals.

Knockout November: As I learn about potential trends among adolescent social media use I try to proactively communicate that information to parents for your awareness. One thing that's trending on TikTok is called knockout November where students are encouraged to fight each other and have it filmed and posted on TikTok. 


FREE & REDUCED LUNCH FORMS:

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CLASSROOM HIGHLIGHTS

6TH GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS-MS. KORZENDORFER



This week sixth graders continued making inferences and supporting their responses with evidence from the **short story All Summer in a Day by Ray Bradbury.** The science fiction story is set on the planet Venus in a world where it continually rains for seven years followed by two hours of sunlight for protagonist, Margo, and her classmates. Students explored themes of jealousy, bullying, and isolation. They were able to sneak in a couple more outdoor learning days where they could live in the sunshine and feel the warmth of the sun as sunlight diminishes and temperatures begin to fall this time of year.

Up next is the middle grade novel Front Desk by Kelly Yang. Themes of immigration, family, racism, the American dream, and the power of the written word will be explored through the eyes of ten year old protagonist Mia Tang. This is the first in a series of four books: Front Desk, Three Keys, Room to Dream, and Key Player.
