2023-2024 School Calendar Survey (results)

Each year, the School Calendar Committee convenes to review and recommend changes for the Dunlap Board of Education to review and approve. The School Calendar Committee is comprised of administrators and teachers.

In order to make sure that the school calendar meets the needs of **all** our stakeholders and that all voices have the opportunity to be heard and considered, the School Calendar Planning Committee is requesting families and staff to complete the following survey. With the survey responses, the Calendar Planning Committee can review and suggest changes that are in line with the needs and preferences of our families and staff, while also meeting District initiatives and requirements posed by the Illinois State Board of Education.

Per the Illinois School Code, school districts **must** create a calendar that has:


- 176 days of student attendance,
- No more than 185 in total (including emergency days, Institute Days, and School Improvement Half-Days), and
- Have no-attendance days on legal holidays that cannot have students in session.


District Employee Question

Dunlap's school calendar is built to provide certified staff members with 4 Institute Days. On these days, students are not in attendance, but certified staff are.

Historically, 2 of these Institute Days are used the Monday and Tuesday before the students' first day in August, another one the Friday before Labor day, and the final one used in either January or March.




Use the Likert Scale below each of the following questions to rate your feelings on a scale of 1-5, where:

- 5 - Very Important


How important is it to have the school year end before Memorial Day?




If Easter does **not** fall close to spring break, "Good Friday" is taken off the weekend of Easter.

(A multiple choice question about spring break and the Easter holiday is included later on.)



Illinois Public School districts **must** have five "emergency days" built in to their school calendar. For the past few years, Dunlap has these days integrated into the calendar either the Monday after easter or the last Fridays in May (if the calendar allows). Then, if the days are used, school is in session (these are currently marked with a red "X" on the [current school year calendar](#)).


How important is it to you having emergency days built into the calendar as it has been the past few years?

The holidays listed in the graph below are permitted legal holidays when schools **can** be in session. However, Dunlap typically observes some of these holidays with a non-attendance day.




