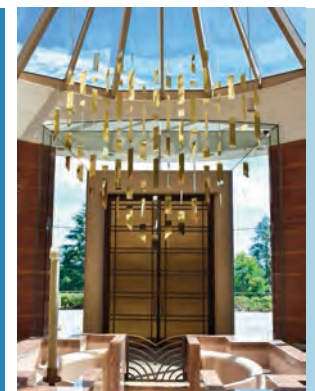
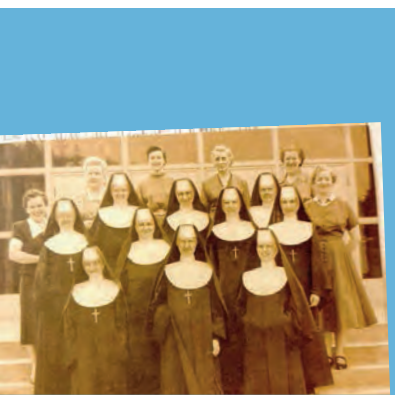

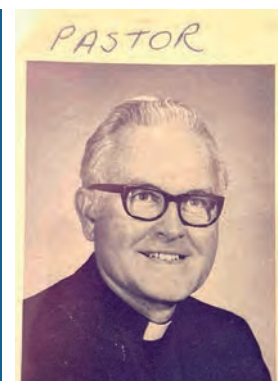

Seventy years after the founding of Sacred Heart School, our very existence as a school community is the result of God's grace and the gifts and talents of many people so generously given all those years ago. They "planted" our school and "tended" it throughout the decades, for the benefit, certainly, of the students, parents, and staff of their time. But they also nurtured Sacred Heart School through seven decades for those who they would never meet and could not know. They freely gave this gift without counting the cost and for this we are deeply grateful.

Fr. Gerald Moore and the Sisters of St. Joseph of Newark led the families of the parish in building the first Catholic school on the Eastside in 1952. It was their faith and dedication that inspired parents at that time to contribute financially and physically in building the core of Sacred Heart School. Over the intervening years, the school has grown in size and resources, thanks to the ongoing generosity of our school families, parishioners, pastors, school staff, alumni, and many benefactors and the Providence of our Lord.

In these last few years, our school and parish community was consistently supportive throughout the challenges of the pandemic. Last year you amazed us with your financial support. The support from our parishioners, parents, parish and school staff, school alumni, and other benefactors not only helped us to strengthen our programs and instruction and add new features like the big toy in the upper lot, but it buoyed our spirits throughout the uncertainty and difficulty of online Mass and classes as we slowly returned to normal.

As you can see from this year's Annual Report, our parish and school community continues to sow seeds for the future. Yes, the good work that we do will benefit people today. But in addition, we give in gratitude for the countless gifts that have made our parish and school what they are now and we give with the Hope in Christ that the good that we do now in cooperation with the Holy Spirit will continue to bear fruit in the next year, the next decade, and another seventy years hence.

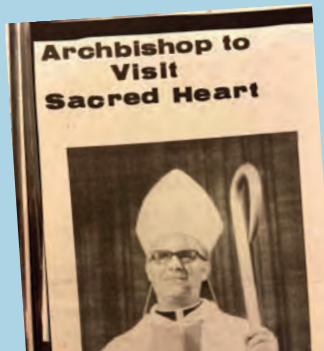
